

Speeding problems

The Parish Council voted to buy a moveable Speed Indicator Device (SID) some time ago and the equipment has now arrived from the manufacturer (Westcotec in Dereham).

We have agreed six sites where the SID can be deployed and four new poles have been installed by County Highways (two other location will use existing

Three sites are on Eagle Way and three on the A1214 through Martlesham.

The SID will be moved from site to site every two weeks or so.

The SID displays a vehicle's speed and flashes Slow Down as appropriate. The system will produce reports on the speed and volume of vehicles by time of day and help to identify hot spots for targeted use of police speed cameras.

Deployment of the equipment will start soon and if you'd like to join our team of enthusiastic volunteers to run the project please contact the Parish Clerk.

REPORT FOR OCTOBER 2021 FROM YOUR CONSERVATIVE DISTRICT COUNCILLOR CHRIS BLUNDELL

The Women's Cycle Tour.

This will start in Haverhill on 9th October 2021 and is expected to pass through Woodbridge and Old Martlesham at about 2.30 pm passing along Sandy Lane, School Lane, Waldringfield Road and Heath, and then on to the finish in Felixstowe. Precise details of the tour route can be found on the East Suffolk Council Website.

Murrell's Park.

Murrell's Park in Purdis Farm will soon be having a complete make-over as both a park and recreation area for use by young and the not so young as well. This has required attention for some time so I am pleased to report that the refurbishment should be completed by March 2022.

Covenants on Martlesham Heath

It was interesting to read in the September Edition of the Martlesham Monthly the 'Covenants Reminder' by Martlesham Heath Householders Ltd., an article on Covenants that apply to properties built on Martlesham Heath.

I felt that I should respond to this as some clarification was needed. East Suffolk Council's (ESC) Planning Department does not normally recognise covenants. If any householder wishes to erect an additional building on their land, then planning permission is required. It should be remembered that the Local Planning Authority (LPA) is concerned with the 'use of land' and is not concerned with who owns the land.

In constructing a boundary fence then it must not exceed 1.87mtrs (6ft) in height including any trellis added to the top of the fence. New boundary walls must not exceed 0.91mtrs (3ft) in height. In item 3 of MHHL's list, the proposed use of any new proposed building is usually also the concern of the LPA.

With respect to item 10 in MHHL's list which is concerned with the parking of vehicles on footpaths and grassed verges. This is extremely difficult to enforce. I understand that in many cases where a road has been adopted, up to 3ft of the grassed area alongside a public highway may be the responsibility of the Highways Authority which in most cases is Suffolk County Council. With newly built estates the amount of space allocate to parking is in my opinion woefully inadequate and therefore if a drive is taken around those new estates both cars and commercial

vehicles seem to be parked both on and off the highway.

Again, with Item 11, the keeping of livestock at any private residence would require the permission of the LPA.

However, on some occasions I have been able to argue successfully, as a member of the planning committee at ESC that since houses can not be either bought or sold on Martlesham Heath without the attached covenant then the covenant must remain in force.

Brightwell Lakes.

I am pleased to report that the first stages of the reserved matters have been approved. They are the 'Construction Environmental Management Plan' and the 'Construction Environmental Plan: Biodiversity Silt Pond Remedial Works' have been permitted.

The District Councillor's Locality Fund.

For the first time since it was introduced in 2013 no organisation has come forward in my ward to seek funding for any community project. Therefore, I still have ample funds to spend so please put your thinking caps on. A good project would be the purchase of new chairs for the Community Hall.

Overgrown Trees and Hedges.

I recently manage to persuade one of our local residents that his lovely laurel hedge had grown almost 3ft over the pavement such that prams and mobility vehicles were having difficulty in getting past it. Since I spoke to him and pointed out the problem, that resident has now significantly reduced the overgrowth thus allowing for the full width of the pavement to be available. I would like to say 'Thank You' to that resident.

On a more serious note, there is a significant problem with trees that grow just inside fences, walls and hedges. When the trees are allowed to go on growing such that they produce substantial amounts of branches that hang down and interfere with walkers, cyclists and scratch passing vehicles. If those branches cause material harm to either the person or vehicle then the owner of the tree is liable for damages. If the tree is on council owned land, then the council is liable. If you have one or more trees that are overgrown, please manage them.



Martlesham Community Responders are a small group of volunteers who are trained to provide local emergency support to the East of England Ambulance Service. We are trained in First Aid and resuscitation, and living locally we can provide an initial response to many emergency 999 calls for the Martlesham area, and we can then assist the ambulance crew after their arrival.

MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP

Heathland will begin to transition towards woodland if it is not managed either by grazing with animals such as sheep, horses or rabbits or by more direct management using tools and machinery. As we do not have the option of using grazing on our local heaths due to the high level of public access, we have to use the second approach to try to maintain and expand the tracts of heather and open landscape that characteristic of heathland. Why not consider coming along to one of our work parties in order to manage this special landscape and wildlife?

Many thanks to all those who came along to our last work party on the heath SSSI when we cut some bracken that if left unchecked would submerge areas of heather and acid grassland. Bracken does not support much wildlife whereas heather and grassland supports a much more wildlife because of the range of plant species and structural diversity that can be used by invertebrates, birds and reptiles.

In October we begin our autumn and winter cycle of scrub clearance on the heath. The bird nesting period is over and so there is no danger of disturbance. Our work party will take place on Sunday 3rd October at 10am. Please meet at the north end of the Heath SSSI opposite the track that comes from the windsock close to the position where we have previously held a bonfire.

As we transition into autumn mushrooms are likely to begin to appear. The appearance of these fruiting bodies is often triggered by a slightly cooler spell accompanied by wetter weather. We should see many varieties through October and November adding there own palette of vivid colours and shapes to our local landscape.

MARTLESHAM IN BLOOM

Autumn in your garden

As the days start getting shorter and we move into autumn, gardeners sometimes start thinking about tidying their garden, but stop! Think again!

Did you know that the leaf litter that has built up on your borders and beds, made up of fallen autumn leaves and twigs is a vital habitat. In there lives a myriad of different organisms some visible to the naked eye, others not, from fungi to worms, woodlice to beetles. This leaf litter provides them with shelter and food and in turn provides birds and other animals further up the food chain with mini beasts to feast on as well as providing goodness to your borders as the leaf litter rots down.

It may also be tempting to cut back all the dead stems on your herbaceous plants, however these can look really architectural in the winter sunlight especially when covered with frost and they provide an ideal site for insects and other invertebrates to spend the winter, in the hollow stems for example. Leaving dead stems standing also helps to protect the crown of the plant below from frost.

We often think about our prickly friends, hedgehogs, in autumn as they prepare to hibernate. Piles of leaves and twigs, undergrowth or under sheds are all places they may make their nest. Also vital to them is being able to travel around the area from garden to garden. By providing a ground level gap in your fence, $13 \, \text{cm} \ x$ $13 \, \text{cm}$ which is about $5 \, \text{"} \ x \, 5 \, \text{"}$ (with your neighbour's permission) you are enabling them, and other wildlife, to access your garden and those beyond.

By leaving some of that leaf litter on your borders, some dead stems on your plants and having a hedgehog hole in the bottom of your fence you will be making a real difference to nature by giving creatures a home and bringing your garden alive with wildlife!



MARTLESHAM HEATH AVIATION SOCIETY

Our August monthly meeting is traditionally replaced by an evening outing. A party of us travelled by coach to the Norfolk and Suffolk Aviation Museum at Flixton near Bungay.

We were greeted by enthusiasts from this remarkable museum with refreshments before looking around at the amazing number of aircraft and memorabilia.

The Norfolk and Suffolk Aviation Museum is situated near to the site of the former RAF Bungay airfield. It was first established in 1972 and more than sixty complete or partial aircraft can be seen there

The airfield was famous during WW2 as the home of the 446th Bomb Group, who came to be known as "the Bungay Buckaroos" after the name of their Suffolk base. They flew B-24 Liberators on strategic, support and interdictory missions over Europe.

Friday September 3rd and we were able to host the second monthly meeting since the lock-down. Air Commodore, (retd), Phil Wilkinson was our distinguished speaker.

Phil Wilkinson's 40 years in the RAF involved thousands of hours in the air. His time on the ground was equally challenging, including exchange appointments at both the French and United States Air Forces War Colleges,

and assignment as commander of the RAF station in Berlin at the time of the Fall of the Wall. His final period of duty was based in Moscow, as Defence and Air Attaché, during the turbulence of Russia's emergence from the Soviet era.

Phil concentrated his talk on the ups and downs of our association with Russia between the Russian air force and politicians in a century of co-existence from the Russian Revolution of 1917.

He travelled widely across the former Soviet Union, including journeys to Murmansk and Archangel, accompanying RAF and other British veterans as they revisited the scenes of their operations in World War Two.

600 RAF men, and aircraft to form two 'Hurricane' squadrons, made up the cargo of the first-ever Arctic Convoy, in August 1941. Those veterans are still linked and supported by a Royal Air Force Russia Association, of which Phil is the director.

We are pleased to be able to report that the Control Tower Museum will once again be open every Sunday afternoon from 2pm to 5pm. until the end of October.

Our next monthly meeting is on Friday, October 1st. Nick Black, who lives at Woodbridge, will be relating the true story of the fatal friendly fire incident that helped the RAF win the Battle of Britain.




