

It's that time of year again to reflect on the past and look forward towards what the new year might bring in the parish.

- Building on the Climate Emergency work that has started, including trying to enhance our bus service.

Could you be Martlesham's next Tree Warden?

Martlesham Parish Council (MPC) is seeking a replacement tree warden for the parish, as John Forbes, the present tree warden wishes to hand over the tasks. He has done an amazing job for countless years, often with the help of his wife. We are so grateful for his dedication to this service.

Mr Forbes describes the role:

It is entirely voluntary and interesting. It is a chance to do something for the community, climate emergency and wildlife.

Duties of the tree warden:

- 1. Encourage the planting of trees and hedges whilst ensuring that aftercare is provided and land ownership is respected.
- 2. Update surveys such as Martlesham part of the Suffolk Hedgerow survey, the veteran tree survey or disease surveys e.g. Ash dieback.
- 3. Inspect trees on MPC land every 6 months (winter & summer) and after gales to check for obvious dangers to the public.
- 4. An independent tree expert inspects on a 2-year basis. The tree warden, in conjunction with office staff, is expected to help sort out the implementation of the expert recommendations e.g. call in a tree surgeon or arrange a voluntary work party, as appropriate.
- 5. 5ESC consult MPC on applications for work on trees with tree preservation orders. The tree warden inspects from the public highway and conveys any local knowledge or likely effects on the street scene.
- If not a member of MPC's Development Plans Committee, occasional attendance to advise on tree issues would be useful but is not essential.
- 7. Attend tree warden training sessions. These are very good enjoyable, interesting and informative. Fees and expenses are met by the Parish Council.

VOLUNTEER PLAY AREA INSPECTORS REQUIRED!

Recently some of our volunteers who have been regularly inspecting our play areas have had to give up. We are very grateful for the work that they have done in making sure our children enjoy safe equipment.

MARTLESHAM COMMUNITY ORCHARD

We are pleased to announce that we plan to plant the first stage of the orchard in February 2020. This will be in the section closest to the entrance to Gorseland school.

We hope to announce the exact date and time for you to come along in the February edition. If we don't manage that due to copy deadlines check the parish council website and facebook page in early February for details.

We plan to have an orchard of full-size trees, the apples using MM111 root stock, which can cope with our poor soil and is disease resistant. There will be room for eight trees and we will make the most of this early phase by having five different varieties of apple, two types of gages and a plum tree. Something for everyone's taste buds

We are also very pleased to announce that the pupils of Gorseland school will be encouraged to take an interest and support us by helping with the watering. We hope that all local schools, groups and societies will consider how the orchard can be a learning experience and an opportunity to help the community by volunteering.

Specifically, as many hands make light work a rota of volunteers is needed to support the team with watering duties, especially during the summer. This will not be onerous, an occasional visit to the orchard to water the trees, from a nearby source of water. Please let the team know via the parish council if you can help.

Tree Planting

As part of our tree planting scheme we have secured some saplings for planting at the rear of Broomfield to deter gorse growth and future fire risk. Planting will take place in early March. Also, a further 3 trees, kindly donated by the Rotary Club, were planted between Westland and Broomfield. We inherited a problem at this location many years ago when a house owner planted Leylandii on MHHL land as a boundary and neglected it. Due to their size we have had to remove these trees. May we remind everyone that MHHL does not accept this as it is a land grab issue.

Parking on Grass Verges

Can we ask members to remind builders and other contractors conducting private work to try and avoid parking on grass verges as this will seriously damage the area? The ground is very soft at this time of year and we do not want to be in a position where we have worn or rutted areas in the summer as this makes it hard to cut and is also unsightly..

Annual Maintenance Payments

Some owners have not yet paid their Annual Maintenance Charge. Unfortunately, they will incur a small surcharge of £2.50. Please note that we do not want to issue these surcharges as it is time consuming and unnecessary. By the time you read this all overdue debtors will have received a statement showing the amount outstanding. Therefore, please can all owners who have not yet paid, now write the cheque or transfer the funds. For all those who have already paid – a big thank you.

Damaged Trees

We have lots of wonderful open land with many trees. If you see any tree branches that have fallen or have become damaged after inclement weather please let us know telephone 01473 612207 and we'll deal with it if it is on our land or we'll pass it on to the landowner. You are strongly advised not to walk in wooded areas during or immediately after inclement weather.

The New Year/Decade

In the new decade there are going to be further issues and pressures on the land. There will be increased demands arising out of the new housing developments with the resultant impact on traffic flow. The committee will work to ensure that the interests of Martlesham Heath are always at the forefront of any actions taken. Should any owners wish to give some time to volunteering they will always be more than welcome and don't forget the AGM which will be held on Tuesday 10thMarch 2020 in the Pavilion. Happy new year – I can hear some people saying that the new decade doesn't start until 1 January 2021.

MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP

Many thanks to all those who came along to our AGM on Friday 22nd November. The Chairman reviewed the activities of the group over the last year and its aspirations for the forthcoming year. The treasurer reviewed the finances of the group, which are in a good position. The existing committee was re-elected for the forthcoming year. Subscriptions were held at the current level. After the formal business had taken place, some of the wildlife surveys that had been undertaken by the group were discussed in more detail, including butterflies, and birds. In 2019 the number of Silver Studded Blue butterflies that were recorded on the Martlesham Heath SSSI were the lowest ever recorded, and their situation has probably been made worse by the fire that swept across part of the heath in September. We can only hope that these butterflies have a good year this year. Our thanks go again to Martlesham Parish Council for continuing to support our work and to all those who have supported us over the year, particularly our band of enthusiastic volunteers.

It was noted at the AGM that we are really in need of additional volunteers particularly for our work parties. Your help would be greatly appreciated in conserving our own special wildlife and thus contributing to the Global initiative that is required to maintain biodiversity. Please consider coming out on our work parties or participating in the Megabashes. Please get in touch via the phone number below or via our e-mail martleshamconservationgrp84@gmail.com.

Our work parties usually take place on the first Sunday of each month. Our first work party of the New Year will take place on Sunday 5th January at 10 am on the heath SSSI. We will continue our heathland conservation by removing more saplings, small trees and encroaching gorse from areas of heather. 



MARTLESHAM PARISH COUNCIL 'MONEY TO PLAY WITH' PROJECT UPDATE

We all know the problems for local communities associated with us living unhealthy and inactive lifestyles. We want to encourage our residents to experience outdoor activity, lead a healthier lifestyle and feel better in themselves, at the same time as enjoying and making the most of the fabulous outdoor spaces which we are so fortunate to have in our parish.

So, when some funding became available for use within Martlesham, and following an earlier consultation that a trim trail, a Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA), and a Bike Trails Pump Track were on our Parish wish list, we set about delivering the most popular project, the trim trail.

We are delighted to report that a Trim Trail around Martlesham Heath and Martlesham Common has been installed on a 5km suggested route. This is a joint venture between the Parish Council, Martlesham Heath Householders Ltd and East Suffolk Council. Altogether there are 10 pieces of equipment at 7 locations with a good trail run between the sites. The route is a recommended route only and laid out in a figure of eight pattern, with a short and long loop, so that you can run or walk as much or as little as you choose. We have a Trim Trail leaflet to download from our website or to collect from the office before you commence the trail, and a free leaflet was delivered to every household in the Parish in the November issue of this magazine.

The Treasures of Ipswich - John Field

Did you know that Ipswich that is full of architectural treasures of historical importance. No, then come along and find out about the town's Mediaeval Churches, Mansions and Halls, its important legacy of Victorian buildings, Nationally and Locally Listed Buildings and the many features and artefacts of local, national (and even some of International) importance.

6th April

Life in a Foundling Hospital, My Experience – Ruth Miller

Burston School Strike - Bryan Thurlow

Did you know that the longest strike in history was not staged by miners but by minors—the children of a small village in Norfolk. On 1 April, 1914, pupils of the Burston village school, supported by their parents, took to the streets in protest at the dismissal of their teachers, Tom and Kitty Higdon. The strike lasted for over 25 years!


