

Tree of the Month - Alder (Alnus glutinosa)



This interesting group of Alder trees can be found on the Run Meadow part of the Martlesham Circular Walk. Alders are commonly found near to fresh water or wet clay areas. The cycle of natural hydration and dehydration assists with the prevention of rotting when the wood becomes waterlogged. For this reason, it was historically used for mill clogs and canal locks.

Male catkins open very early resembling a yellow-brown sugar puff, whilst the little dark red female flowers on the same trees, open into cone-like woody fruit whose seeds float on water. Alder leaves remain on the tree dark green into November. Mature trees can reach a height of around 28m and live to approximately 60 years. Thanks to Tree Warden, John Burges for proposing this month's tree.

Development News Bramble Way, Black Tiles

Brightwell Lakes

Members of Martlesham Council attend meetings of the Brightwell Lakes Community Forum. At the April forum, members were given an update on the progress of the proposed new school by members of the School's Infrastructure team at Suffolk County Council:

Design work is being undertaken for a new primary school at Brightwell Lakes. Suffolk County Council is currently undertaking the 'presumption' process to select an Academy Trust to operate the school. A reserved matters planning application for an Early Years and Primary facility will be submitted in winter 2025. Taylor Wimpey will transfer the school land to Suffolk County Council.

The Construction period for Early Years and Primary facilities will run between May 2026 and August 2027. An Early Years and Primary facility will open in September 2027.

The smallest secondary school Suffolk County Council will be permitted to open by the DfE is 600 places. Forecasts suggest the demand for places from Brightwell Lakes is 300 pupils. An additional 150 places will be added to Kesgrave High School from September 2027. Suffolk County Council will continue to monitor places for secondary school pupils.

Martlesham in Bloom



Warm weather is with us now and any summer showers will be appreciated by all our trees, shrubs and wildlife, also by us gardeners. Some early flowering plants will be past their best, but many summer flowering plants can be helped by deadheading to prolong flowering. With dahlias and cosmos for example if the blooms that have died are removed it encourages further buds to grow. Always be careful when deadheading plants that you are removing the spent blooms not new buds! It can be easy to do! If in doubt leave them for a little while and watch to check that what you are about to remove was the spent one, then put your new knowledge into practice.

Look in garden centres and nurseries for perennials such as Salvia 'Hot lips' and Nepeta which can be added to borders to fill gaps or grown in containers; both are examples of different shaped flowers that we enjoy and benefit pollinators. Bees, wasps, hoverflies, moths and other insects are all very important garden visitors and residents, they pollinate our flowers including fruit and vegetables.

Other wildlife is also important such as hedgehogs, foxes and badgers. Having a small source of water in several areas of your garden is of enormous benefit to all wildlife and can be as simple as a saucer, which is not too deep or has sloping sides so that creatures can climb out. Many birds are still nesting so be careful when cutting any hedges which have put on growth in the last few weeks.

Watering is key at this time of the year, many plants can cope with out extra water particularly established ones, however containers will need to be kept watered and the best time is in the evening to reduce water evaporating and maximize what gets to the roots. Perennials and shrubs which you have planted this year may also need watering if the weather is dry to get them established. Remember rain does not always reach areas near fences, hedges and walls, this is called a rain shadow and will always be drier than your open garden. Summer flowering annuals and fruit and vegetables in containers or baskets will also benefit from feeding, which helps keep them healthy.

Summer flowers and foliage of ornamental and edible plants will be putting on a lovely display this month for you and the local wildlife to enjoy.

UPDATE FROM MARTLESHAM WILDS

If you've been for a walk at Martlesham Wilds recently, you will have noticed the dragonflies have started appearing.

Last year we recorded 12 species of dragonfly and 3 species of damselfly. This year we hope to record more.

The number and variety are great indicators of the health of the freshwater habitat at Martlesham Wilds, as these species can live for several years as nymphs in freshwater ponds, before emerging as stunning acrobats and delighting us as we walk! If you are a keen dragonfly enthusiast and would be interested in joining the survey team, this summer, please do email

Work will be starting soon on creating more ponds and scrapes on the ex-arable fields and the grazing marshes, which will further improve habitats for these and many other species – so do keep a look out.

You may also have seen some lovely new benches on your walk as well. These have been donated in memorium of loved ones, and are a welcome rest for tired feet. While we highly recommend taking a moment to sit, relax and enjoy the views and wildlife around, it is really important, especially at this time of year, not to put out cigarettes on the dry ground, as this is a huge fire risk on such tinder dry grass.

MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP

Martlesham Conservation Group would like to thank all who took part in the Martlesham Heath Open Gardens event on 7th June and especially to the organisers for the donation to our Group, which will be spent on furthering our conservation work in the village particularly on Martlesham Heath site of special scientific interest (SSSI).

We would like to thank Mike Ward for masterminding the event, all the people who put their gardens forward for a visit (with all the hard work behind that), the Scouts and other helpers, and all who came along. It was a great afternoon. Also, it was great see the variety of garden concepts and all the different ways that people are encouraging wildlife whilst producing beautiful gardens.

Thanks again to Martlesham Scouts who joined members of our Group on 5th June and cut back intrusive vegetation along a path on the SSSI and helped to suppress the growth of invasive bracken on an area of young heather. These actions should benefit both wildlife and walkers.

This is all part of our annual summer campaign to cut and clear bracken on the heath SSSI.

Our long term aim is to increase the area of heather and reduce the area of bracken because heather supports a much wider diversity of wildlife than bracken and is particularly good for invertebrates, which include the nationally rare Silver Studded Blue butterfly. These butterflies are not on the wing for long so if you get on to the Heath before early July or sooner it may give the best chance to see them until next year. They may be seen around the clumps of heather next to the paths towards the southern end of the publicly accessible part of the heath SSSI.

Martlesham Heath SSSI is a very good site for butterflies. As well as the Silver Studded Blue butterfly other species that may be seen through July include the Meadow Brown, the Ringlet, the Purple Hairstreak, Large, Small, and Essex skippers, Small Tortoiseshell, Peacock, Painted Lady, Red Admiral, Large, Small, and Green Veined White and several others. Please take some time to take a look. You may even find some of these species in your garden.

We have two native species of snake present on the heath, the adder and the grass snake, as well as two other native species of reptile, the slow worm and the common lizard.

These reptiles are cold blooded animals and consequently need to bask sometimes in sunny spots usually close to cover of some sort so that they can easily disappear if disturbed. Alternatively in hotter weather they may seek shade in order to lower their body temperature.

If you come across one unexpectedly and you are concerned it is best to step back and let the animal get out of your way of its own accord. It may take a few minutes if the animal is cold. You should never try to pick one up or attempt to harm them. Adders are venomous.

Martlesham Heath Aviation Society report for Friday 6th June Meeting

Members and friends came along on Friday 6th June to hear fellow member Stuart Buxton reveal a critical part of national infrastructure - with his deeply researched talk "The Secret Oil Pipeline That Helped Win the War".

He started with the truism that modern nations (and this includes the Second World War) cannot successfully wage war without fuel. To this end the Petroleum War Board (PWB) was set up at the start of World War 2, with the cooperation of oil company experts from home and abroad. It was obvious at the start of the second World War that we needed to greatly expand the fuel that we as a country would need – however there had been strong moves in this direction from earlier in the 1930's.

The RAF in 1935 was told at that time to stock

only enough fuel for 6 weeks. Consider a Squadron of Spitfires, each plane initially held 85 gallons of fuel, and a Hurricane fighter Squadron would burn over 1,000 gallons per mission. The PWB looked at the possible future requirements, and it became apparent that road tankers, especially in wartime, were not going to be able to cope, and railways would likely be overwhelmed with the requirements. It was proposed that a network of buried pipes be set up across the UK, along with extra storage tanks at strategic points. The system was swiftly constructed - with 170km of unwelded pipelines (buried only 5 feet deep - surprisingly shallow) installed from June to November 1940. This was just the start. It soon became operational, with special patrols set up to patrol and look for leaks. The system ended up being 1,500 km long. Extra strain on the supply in Eastern England and elsewhere was caused with the arrival of the Americans, with their air Armada., and stretched further by the requirements for DD Day and afterwards – the invading Allied forces being supplied by a Pipe Line Under the Ocean (PLUTO) from the Isle of Wight to Cherbourg. The Germans never managed to match the fuel capacity of the Allies and as the war developed, with the bombing of their Refineries etc, they became starved of fuel. This was a vital key to the Allied Victory, despite the Germans in desperation, extracting fuel from coal. The pipeline network is still in use today, feeding Airports, with the Pipework updated. Some is also used these days to transport gas. The talk was a revelation to most in the
