Tree of the Month

Decaying tree

In December 2013, a combination of low pressure, strong winds and spring tides caused a tidal surge on the East Coast. Parts of inland Martlesham Creek, now part of 'Martlesham Wilds', were flooded with salt water from the Deben estuary, resulting in the loss of several mature trees.

However, standing dead trees such as this provide invaluable rich habitats for wildlife. They can provide homes for pollinating insects such wasps and bees, bats and many species of invertebrate and small mammals.

Resignation of Mike Williamson, Chairman of the Parish Council

Blacktiles Lane - historic finds

Some key finds to date are an Iron Age thatch weight (see photo) that would have been used to weigh down the thatch on roofs and a possible small posted structure that could have been a store building or animal pen. In addition, they have also found some Roman pottery.

Visitors Spaces

MHHL (or MCL originally) owns and maintains 66 hard-standing car parking spaces on Martlesham Heath. These were originally provided specifically for the use of visitors to the village.

However, circumstances have changed considerably, and most notably there has been an increase in car ownership. Many families own two or more cars but often do not have sufficient garaging or parking within their own property, resulting in a large number of cars regularly parked on the highway. In some places this causes serious congestion.

In November 2004, after a review of the use of these spaces, MHHL decided that it was both impractical and inappropriate to enforce the original rules, and therefore, extended them to allow ad-hoc use by residents, as well as visitors under the following terms:

- The spaces are owned and maintained by MHHL and demarcated by either "MHHL" painted on the ground or by appropriate signage.
- MHHL car parking spaces will be available for use by residents, as well as visitors.
- Car parking spaces may only be used for cars that are taxed and in regular use on the road. Spaces must not be used for storage of untaxed, SORN (Statutory Off Road Notification), unroadworthy cars, equipment, materials, skips or any other non-approved use.
- Vans, it must be remembered that these spaces were designed in the early 80's when cars and Vans in particular were smaller than today's designs.
 Consequently, most of the spaces are unsuitable for large panel vans and we would ask that residents park these and other commercial vehicles on their own private parking spaces rather than the MHHL spaces.
- It must be ensured that vehicles do not drip oil or otherwise contaminate the parking space. Users causing problems with the cleanliness or condition of spaces may be charged for the cost of cleaning or repairs.
- Users are asked to park carefully within the spaces.
- Residents are asked to use these spaces in a reasonable manner, with regard and consideration for fellow residents and their visitors. Spaces are not to become an extension of residents own parking areas. Regular, sustained or exclusive use of a space will not be tolerated.

Grass Verges

• Please note that MHHL does not allow parking on any of the grassed areas that it owns unless specific permission is given by MHHL.

Residents are asked to observe these rules in order to avoid damaging the appearance of the Village.

DISTRICT COUNCIL MONTHLY UPDATE

We have now completed the second month of the new administration. People have been given responsibilities and I have been elected chair of the planning meetings in the south of East Suffolk.

Each Tuesday morning there is a zoom meeting with officers to decide whether applications that have been referred should be delegated to officers or need to be further discussed at the monthly meeting. There are usually 4 or 5 such applications to revue each week.

Planning meetings are held each month and each application that has been referred is presented to the committee by a council officer. The appointed group of councillors debate and then decide whether to approve or deny the application.

On July 11 I joined several councillors at Felixstowe Port to be given a presentation and drive round the port area. The port is owned by a Hong Kong company and has always been privately owned since being set up in 1870's.

Most of the cargo comes in from the far east on large container ships holding as many as 5,000 containers and is then distributed by rail and truck.

The A14 is a key factor in the truck distribution. The containers are mostly sent back empty, the main export is our rubbish, plastic bags and the like. They showed us their new electric unmanned trucks being trialled for port use, they have ordered several and are made in China.

MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP

The heathland of Martlesham Heath is particularly able to support a range of butterflies as there is a great mix of vegetation including heather, gorse, grassland and trees with areas of short vegetation that suit many butterflies. These butterfly species include a nationally rare species, the Silver Studded Blue butterfly that uses heather and some other plants as its caterpillar food plant. It is important for wildlife conservation to try to maintain a good extent of heather and grassland and avoid dominance of some species of plant such as Bracken.

Although a common plant of heathland, Bracken is poor for conservation purposes as unfortunately it only supports a narrow range of wildlife in part due its toxic nature but also because it has the ability to smother other underlying plants. The dwarf shrub layer of heather and grassland that it may have replaced is much more beneficial in comparison, supporting a wide range of invertebrates and higher animals (birds, reptiles, and mammals such as rabbits). Consequently it is important to reduce the extent and coverage of bracken in order to promote more heather and grassland to the benefit of a wider range of wildlife.

Bracken continues to dominate in some areas of our heath although we have had some success in pushing it back in other areas due to an ongoing regime of cutting and spraying. Our work parties over this summer have focused on trying to control bracken in a particular area that has underlying heather.

In August we may see some Grayling butterflies, these are a typical butterfly of dry sandy heathland relying on sparsely growing fine grasses such as Sheep's Fescue and plenty of bare ground in open sunny positions. Several areas of the heath were scraped to help promote similar conditions. You may also see the second emergence of several other butterflies including the Common Blue and Brown Argus butterflies.

Our work party in August will take place on **Sunday 6th August at 10am**.

Please meet on the Martlesham Heath SSSI on the bank that runs east-west just along from the interpretive sign that sits between Heathfield and the Oaks.

We carried out our annual glow-worm (*Lampyris noctiluca*) survey in early July, recording the green glows of 5 females. This is quite a low number compared to historic records. The surveyors were delighted to hear and briefly see a female tawny owl (*Strix aluco*) in the darkness.

Martlesham in Bloom

Now that August is here, summer flowering plants will be in full bloom in our gardens and outdoor spaces accompanied by insects of all shapes and sizes. Most summer flowering plants, fruit, and vegetables in containers and window boxes will benefit from a feed of fertilizer such as liquid tomato food. This will encourage more flowering and fruiting.

If you would like to extend the variety of plants and wildlife in your garden, why not consider a container pond? They can be very easy to create and can be whatever size you would like. At its most basic all you need is a container with no holes in the bottom into which you put one or more marginal or moisture loving plants that live in water or very boggy ground, such as the lovely flowering Lobelia cardinalis, the colourful leaved Houttuynia cordata 'Chameleon' or grassy looking Acorus gramineus 'Variegatus' in their pots, and fill up the container with water to the top of their pots.

Do bear in mind safety if you have young children, many people opt not to have any open water while children are young. Solid safety mesh can be fixed across the top of a container pond and it can be put in a location which children cannot access without supervision.

Another important addition is a piece of wood sloping out of the water or bricks or similar put in the container to provide a way of animals getting out of the water if they fall in. If the plant pots fill most of the container the top of them may be able to act as a way out.

The bonus of a mini water feature like this is that not only will you enjoy the plants, but it will attract wildlife, by doubling up as an important source of water for birds, insects and other animals.

Don't forget to take time to enjoy your gardens and outdoor spaces!

Getting to know Martlesham Wilds

To follow on from Charlie's first news about Martlesham Wilds last month I am very happy to introduce myself as the site warden and give an update on what's been happening on the reserve. Although we have only just begun it has been a very busy start, and it has been heartening and inspiring that so many people have been giving us a hand! At the moment we are unable to start any work on the arable part of the reserve, but we have begun many surveys (bird, butterfly, dragonfly, bat) and have many more planned over the course of the summer. These are helping us to understand the site, and giving us a point from which we can start monitoring the changes that are to come.

We already have good news with the number of bat species on site, and some promising indications of good water vole populations, amongst other things. How we manage the site will be informed by all this information and we will be doing our best to keep what is already great, great, and make some changes to other, currently less biodiverse parts of the landscape that will hopefully become busier and busier with the activity of more and more species. We will keep you posted in this space!

Interestingly, a new initiative has just launched to engage concerned citizens who don't want to take disruptive action like 'Just Stop Oil'. It is called the 'Climate Majority Project'. More details at https://climatemajorityproject.com. I think we are ahead of the curve here!

'Hydrogen ready boilers' - more misinformation

I keep hearing from the fossil fuel industry that heat pumps for domestic

heating and hot water are not needed as hydrogen boilers are coming. The problem is they are very much less efficient than a heat pump. Basic physics shows you that 1 unit of green electricity produced by renewables and transmitted by the grid to a heat pump will deliver around 2.7 units of energy at the home with 300% efficiency of the heat pump and allowing some losses transmitting the electricity across the grid. However, 1 unit of green electricity used to produce 'green hydrogen' by electrolysis of water will deliver around 0.5 units of energy to your house with losses due to the electrolysis process, leakage in the gas grid (hydrogen is a smaller molecule than methane so more leakage) and 90% efficiency burning it in a hydrogen boiler in the home. This is around 5 times less efficient than a heat pump and it is difficult to see how it could compete on price even with heat pump installations being more expensive than a gas boiler (at the moment; the gap is narrowing)! If we are serious about tackling climate change, then hydrogen is not the answer for most homes. Hydrogen is, however, key to decarbonising things like concrete and steel production and powering back up power stations, large ships and the like.

MARTLESHAM HEATH AVIATION SOCIETY

On 29th June following a long period of dry, sunny weather, the group were looking forward to a warm, sunny day. However, no such luck, heavy rain the night before and colder, showery conditions saw our 23 visitors standing on Orford Quay at 10am waiting for the National Trust ferry.

Two trips later, the 23, (some with wet bottoms from the seating on the uncovered ferry!) were greeted on the Ness by David Warren to be given a tour of the early Royal Flying Corps and RAF airfield area and some remaining buildings and then on to the area used after 1945 by AWRE (Atomic Weapons Research Establishment) with the dilapidated remains of several test laboratory buildings where various bombs, including the UK nuclear arsenal (but with no nuclear warheads) were tested. (unfortunately, due to their unsafe structures, it is impossible to enter most of them).

The seaward side of the Ness is a long barren, exposed, almost lunar landscape of exposed shingle and, when used as a German prisoner of war camp, must have made the occupants wonder why they were being asked to fight for somewhere so desolate! Also, it was sad to note that the long-established sight of the lighthouse is no more, recently demolished due to coastal erosion.

However, the visit was most informative and interesting, with the added background commentary from David, with the benefit of the depth of research into the history by him and his colleagues. It was a most enjoyable and satisfying day.

If readers have never toured the 'Ness do so – to get a completely different view of a part of Suffolk still little known to many.

Our Monthly Meeting on 7th July started with a Long Service "Silver Owl" Award from the Association for Suffolk Museums for Alan Powell – recognising his long and diligent service to our Aviation Society.

Alan for more than 25 years has been our Society Secretary, and Newsletter, as well as helping the Society in other ways in all that time. Congratulations and Thanks Alan. You can now spend more time taking amazing photographs, your favourite hobby.

Clive and Linda Denney, then talked about the renovation of a DeHavilland Tiger Moth, one of about 9,000 of this 1930's design, with many upwards of 700 still flying – which says much for the esteem this Trainer aircraft is held in to this day. It was often said that the Americans never used them in this country – when they came into World War 2 – however they used about 16 in American colours. Clive decided to rebuild his Tiger Moth in American markings, and typically he rebuilt it from the ground up – even finding an unused Gipsy Moth engine found in Argentina. This may seem extreme, but Clive said to have an engine of the period stripped and overhauled would probably cost in excess of £50K to £60K even after finding and purchasing one.

The aircraft rebuild took about 14 years, and he thought it probably equates to £152K. He said that to buy a second Hand Tiger would probably cost about £82K – but you would probably have to pay lots in money and time to get it truly in safe flying condition.

Typically, of Clive and Linda – they wanted to get everything right – as they hope, as they get older, to use this Tiger as their fun aircraft project. Clive and Linda's "Vintage Fabrics" – based near Audley End in Essex, is always busy rebuilding and re-covering other vintage and veteran Aircraft – for other Aircraft owners – this mean that work on their own aircraft was often push to the back – explaining why it took so long. Clive showed us pictures of what Vintage Fabrics are doing at present – showing a hangar bursting with aircraft being re-built. This produced a flurry of requests for a Society visit.

On Sunday 6th August – we go on a Trip to the Shuttleworth Collection's "Carnival" display of vintage and veteran Aircraft, where we will no doubt see some flying *Tiger Moths*..

Our next Monthly Talk is on Friday 1st September, when Chris Turland presents a new talk all about the "Flying Flea" and other disastrous and dangerous aircraft designs from the dawn aviation to more recent times.

Following this on Sunday 10^{th} September – is our Annual Classic Car and Military Vehicle Meet at our Control Tower Museum from 11:00 to 16:00. More on this in next Month's issue.
