



Martlesham Parish Council declares a Climate Emergency

Our full statement can be found on our website. We note that we already have activities in place which mitigate the effects of climate change, but further work needs to be done in the areas of land management, transport, the built environment and parish council operational activities. Our powers are limited in some areas, particularly transport, but we will work to encourage sustainable forms of transport, and reductions in energy, water and power use. We will also encourage appropriate planting and manage habitats to mitigate the climate emergency, encourage bio-diversity and maximise carbon capture.

Cuts to Martlesham bus services

Thank you to all who have contacted us about your experiences with the buses & the difficulties that have arisen as a result of the cuts. We share your concerns. At the time of writing the Council is organising a meeting with representatives of First Bus and Suffolk County Council in partnership with neighbouring parishes, which have also been adversely affected. Our aim is to develop a sufficiently attractive public transport offering that would be sustainable in the long run. Current timetables are available on https://www.suffolkonboard.com/.

Suffolk Coastal Local Plan Examination

The independent Inspection of the Suffolk Coastal Local Plan has now taken place. We were represented at a number of key hearings as we were challenging the Plan regarding lack of consultation over the inclusion of the Suffolk Police HQ site for 300 houses and disregard for our Neighbourhood Plan. The outcome is yet unknown. You will find latest news on the East Suffolk Council website:

Sizewell C Stage 4 Public Consultation

This consultation has now closed. The Council continues to consider that there is insufficient information to support a new

nuclear power station. For Martlesham the road led strategy will exacerbate traffic on the A12. The Council supports a rail or sea led strategy over road. We support a sector wide energy plan; Sizewell C seems to be planned in isolation from other major infrastructure proposals affecting the region. We have raised concerns about the potential use of laybys along the A12, in particular the layby opposite the BT tower should not be used as an overnight stay for lorry drivers. Emergency planning still needs to be more fully

LAST OPPORTUNITY - Grants to local organisations in 2020

The Parish Council will be considering all applications for grants from local organisations in the autumn. If your group wishes to apply for a grant, please contact the Clerk for an application form, to be completed and returned to the Parish Council by Monday 07 October 2019. Any group with a project requiring Parish Council support/funding should also submit their project details and business plan by 07 October 2019 at the latest.

Ipswich Northern Route (INR) Public Consultation: Martlesham Parish Council's opposition and the STOP! Campaign

The public consultation has now closed. After careful consideration of the available evidence the Council agreed at its meeting on 04 September 2019 to strongly oppose the proposed INR project. Key reasons identified:

- Flawed data out of date data used and inadequate traffic projections;
- Impact on Martlesham The INR would result in a massive increase in congestion in the Martlesham area, significantly impacting on the environment and quality of life (road safety, air quality and noise);
- Wider impacts and environmental issues the effect would be devastating and irreversible. Alternative strategies have not been seriously considered.

Our full response is available on our website.

Neighbouring parishes, county councillors and our MPs, Thérèse Coffey & Dan Poulter, are also opposing the INR. Some parish councils are supporting the STOP! campaign. This Council is minded to support the campaign but would like to hear what you think before signing up. We believe that they are an extremely well informed and professional group, who have researched the topic meticulously and are investing in seeking expert opinion. They are instructing an independent review of the traffic analysis and "intend to instruct a transport specialist to review alternative ways of reducing congestion in Ipswich and the 31 other solutions discarded by Suffolk County Council". CHRIS BLUNDELL'S DISTRICT COUNCILLOR REPORT OCTOBER 2019

The Bus Service. Unfortunately, the bus service that links Martlesham with other places is a private matter between the First Bus Company and the Traffic Commissioners with the County Council as consultees. There is no connection with the East Suffolk Council so I was unable to take any action but to lend my concerns to all our residents. However, a big thank you is probably due to the Martlesham Parish Council who alerted the Media to the considerable distress that was being caused by the proposal to remove the bus services. I understand that some sense prevailed and that the service will remain but in a more limited form. Thank you to all our protesters!

Orwell Green Proposals. This proposal for an additional 2,700 new homes on land west of the A12 and north of the Seven Hills Junction was a matter of great concern to many residents. However, I am pleased to report that the planning application has been withdrawn. Gladman's have an additional twelve months in which to resubmit their plans. We will have to wait and see!

East Suffolk Council has now introduced a new way of working for the benefit of all our local communities. You may have seen recently in the East Anglia Daily Times (10th September) an Article describing the Introduction to a new Partnership Scheme where many organisations can bid for funds from East Suffolk Council through a Partnership program.

The District has been divided into eight areas with several wards and ward members working in partnership to hopefully encourage applications for grants that will be awarded on the basis of greatest local benefit and need. Our local area includes Kesgrave, Rushmere St Andrews, Carlford & Fynn Valley and Martlesham & Purdis Farm (i.e. four adjacent wards).

Parking on MHHL Land

We have received complaints that some residents are parking on MHHL land. In order that we keep these areas in good condition can I remind everyone that this is not permitted. We will be placing small signs on certain areas, to remind residents and visitors that such parking is not permitted.

Control Tower

Some much needed repairs and maintenance are currently being carried out at the Control Tower. These repairs include refurbishment of the MHHL office on the ground floor to combat damp and mould and the planning for installation of an improved fire alarm system. If you have never been to the museum at the Control Tower may I recommend a visit. The museum is run by dedicated volunteers and has lots of fascinating exhibits dating back to the beginning of the airfield. Please note that repairs are also being carried out to the revetments next to the Control Tower. If you or your children are in the area, please stay clear of the repairs until they are completed.

Annual Maintenance Charge

In September, we will begin processing the 2019-2020 Annual Maintenance Fees. For the third year in a row the charge has been kept at £35. This small fee is achieved by reason of the fact that MHHL is managed by unpaid directors and volunteers. Just over a year ago MHHL received a quote from a management company to take over the administration at nearly 3 times the current charge. A great deal of time and effort goes into issuing and distributing the annual charge and prompt payment as ever would be much appreciated.

MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP

Heathland will begin to transition towards woodland if it is not managed either by grazing with animals such as sheep, horses or rabbits or by more direct management using tools and machinery. As we do not have the option of using grazing on our local heaths due to the high level of public access, we have to use the second approach to try to maintain and expand the tracts of heather and open landscape that characteristic of heathland. Why not consider coming along to one of our work parties in order to manage this special landscape and wildlife?

Over the summer much of our practical activity on the heath SSSI has been taken up in trying to control some of the areas of bracken that if left unchecked would submerge areas of heather or acid grassland. Both heather and grassland are able to support a much wider range of wildlife than bracken. Many thanks to all those volunteers who persisted in this activity over another hot summer.

In October we begin our autumn and winter cycle of scrub clearance on the heath. Our work party will take place on Sunday 6th October at 10am. Please meet at the north end of the Heath SSSI opposite the track that comes from the windsock close to the position where we have previously held a bonfire.

As we transition into autumn mushrooms are likely to begin to appear. The appearance of these fruiting bodies is often triggered by a slightly cooler spell accompanied by wetter weather. We should see many varieties through October and November adding there own palette of vivid colours and shapes to our local landscape.

The fire in September on the privately owned section of the Heath SSSI (beyond the barbed wire fence) is likely to have had a very detrimental effect on the local wildlife including the Silver Studded Blue butterflies, other insect, mammal (especially rabbits) and reptile populations. We will monitor the situation as best as we can and hope that the vegetation will recover well and allow wildlife to re-populate from other parts of the Heath in the longer term.

PORTAL WOODLANDS CONSERVATION GROUP

A local birder inspired by our recent wildlife reports decided to visit our woodlands to see what he could spot. In just a little over an hour he had identified an incredible 18 different bird species.

Autumn is the best time of year to spot the colourful array of fungi that grow from the woodland floor and fallen decaying branches. Please do not remove any that you find, and, definitely do not attempt to eat any!

Finally, with Guy Fawkes Night approaching we would like to take this opportunity to remind those having bonfires to carefully check beforehand to ensure no hedgehogs (or any other creatures) have taken up residence.

We hope to hear your visit reports and of course if you are interested in helping maintain the woodlands then contact us to find out more, or just turn up at one of our work mornings.





RAF 75TH ANNIVERSARY

Although RAF Bentwaters is best known for hosting the United States Air Force from 1951 to 1993 when the base closed, during the Second World War it was home to RAF fighters of 11 Group from 1944 to 1945.

To celebrate the 75th anniversary of the arrival of the RAF, the Bentwaters Cold War Museum is holding a special open day on Sunday 20th October from 10.00 to 4.00.

The Americans had built the airfield in 1944 but handed it over to the RAF and on 22nd November 1944 it was declared operational, the last airfield in the UK to be activated in WWII. The first aircraft arrived on 11th December 1944 with Mustang fighters of 129 Squadron, quickly followed by 118 and 165 Squadron with Spitfires (though they were soon replaced by the Mustang). By the end of December another three Mustang squadrons had arrived (64, 126 and 234) bringing the total to six, a very large number for a single base.

Tasked with escorting RAF bombers and carrying out ground attack missions, the squadrons soon threw themselves into the fight against Germany with an escort mission to Trier where RAF Lancasters bombed railway yards. Unlike the Spitfire, which had limited fuel and therefore range, the Mustang could fly deep into enemy territory and protect the vulnerable bombers from German Luftwaffe attack.

At this late stage in the war the Luftwaffe was ill equipped to defend the skies and combat was rare. However the new rocket and jet fighters were encountered and one Bentwaters pilot was credited with destroying there is plenty of parking space. a Me262 jet. Several pilots lost their lives

from anti-aircraft fire, accidents or mechanical failures. One was a Norwegian Wing Commander, Major Arne Austeen, who tragically was shot down and crashed into the sea on the last mission flown from Bentwaters on 4th May 1945, when the Mustangs were attacking U-Boats in a fjord in Denmark.

Another who made the ultimate sacrifice was Flight Lieutenant David Drew, who was just 22 years old when he perished in his Mustang in Copenhagen as he tried to avoid civilian houses after being shot down. He and 27 other Bentwaters pilots were escorting low level bombers to attack the Gestapo headquarters in a daring raid to free Danish resistance fighters from imprisonment and torture. He is buried in a Copenhagen cemetery which is attended by the local council and flowers are laid each year on his

With the war over in Europe, the Mustangs left Bentwaters and a chapter in the history of the base came to a close. The RAF remained until 1949 using the airfield for training on the new jets.

And in 1951 the arrival of the United States Air Force signified a new era and the expansion of both Bentwaters and nearby Woodbridge. A period that many local residents remember with affection.

The open day at the museum on the 20th October will showcase a new expanded display of RAF information and there will be talks on the RAF era throughout the day.

Admission is £5 for adults and free entry to children. Refreshments are available and
