

As well as making decisions on how we look after local play areas, street furniture, open spaces etc., we need councillors to take an active interest in how we respond to consultations (or lack of consultation) which are likely to have an impact on our well-being and quality

# The next opportunity to be appointed to the Council is 04 September 2019.

## **Grants to local organisations in 2020**

The Parish Council will be considering all applications for grants from local organisations in the autumn. If your group wishes to apply for a grant, please contact the Clerk for an application form, to be completed and returned to the Parish Council by Monday 07 October 2019. These grants are awarded for the financial year 2020/21 and will be presented at the Annual Parish Meeting in April 2020. Any group with a project requiring Parish Council support/funding should also submit their project details and business plan by 07 October 2019 at the latest.

# **Changes to Martlesham bus services**

This has been a hot topic during August with the announcement that from O1 September the route 66 would no longer travel around Eagle Way, and service 64 will no longer serve old Martlesham. We issued press releases and letters of complaint to Suffolk County Council (SCC) and First Bus. As I write, Radio

Suffolk has just informed us that First Bus has had a change of heart and the 66 bus will continue to serve Eagle Way once an hour Mon – Sat daytimes. This minor concession is welcomed but we still need to review what bus service provision we are left with. Thank you to everyone who complained to SCC and the bus company. ## **Suffolk Coastal Local Plan Examination**

When you read this the Local Plan Examination will have started. Details were reported in the August newsletters. All the documents can be found on the East Suffolk Council website: https://tinyurl.com/SC-Local-Plan-

Examination

This is of particular significance to the parish because of the inclusion of the Suffolk Police HQ site for 300 houses and the Woodbridge Town Football Club site in the north of the parish for 120 dwellings. The Council has made written representations of objection to the Inspector on the way in which consultation has been handled and polices drawn up for these sites. The former Suffolk Coastal District Council had made it clear in their first round of consultation last summer, and in line with our Neighbourhood Plan, that the majority of the community's housing needs would be met by the Brightwell Lakes provision so no further land allocation was required for housing. This has been overturned in the Final Draft Local Plan. The Parish Council is listed to participate at key Hearings.

# Ipswich Northern Route Public Consultation

The public consultation on the proposed routes for the northern relief road runs until 13 September 2019. East Suffolk Council and Ipswich Borough Council are exploring options to "create a new road to enable better journeys across Suffolk

as well as enable future growth". Each of the 3 options could have a significant impact on traffic through Martlesham on the A12 so please make your comments known! We'd like to hear your views too. All information is available via www.ipswichnorthernroute.org.uk . If you need more information you can contact the project team via: telephone 0345 603 1842 or e-mail lpswichnorthernroute@suffolk.gov.uk. The Parish Council will agree its response at its meeting on 04 September.





# **REMEMBERING MARTLESHAM'S AVIATION PAST**

It is many years since Martlesham Heath was the site of an historic airfield and many landmarks remain to this day, including the 1920's built hangar in Gloster Road.

The aviation history of the village is remembered in other ways. Gloster Road is named after the Gloster Aircraft Company. It became part of the Hawker Siddeley group in 1963, but actually designed the first British jet aircraft, the Gloster E28/39.






Martlesham's industrial area is called Beardmore Park. The Beardmore Inflexible was the largest aircraft in the world in 1928 and was based at Martlesham.

Weighing 15 tons and with an all metal construction and 150 ft wingspan it was underpowered and not successful. One of the enormous 11ft high wheels survives and can be seen in the Science museum in London.

Anson Road is named after the Avro Anson, another







Lancaster Drive is sure to have been named after the legendary Avro Lancaster bomber of WW2.



Valiant Road is named after the Vickers Valiant The first of the "V" bombers and capable of carrying the atom bomb in the late 50's.

Westland is another road that probably derives its name from another famous British aircraft company.

The Westland Lysander was tested at RAF Martlesham in the mid 1930's as an army co-operation aircraft and is probably the best known aeroplane from that famous company.
