

As the full Council does not formally meet in August, the next opportunity to be appointed is 04 September 2019. Grants to local organisations in 2020

The Parish Council will be considering all applications for grants from local

organisations in the autumn. If your group wishes to apply for a grant, please contact the Clerk for an application form, to be completed and returned to the Parish Council by Monday 07 October 2019. These grants are awarded for the financial year 2020/21 and will be presented at the Annual Parish Meeting in April 2020. Any group with a project requiring Parish Council support/funding should also submit their project details and business plan by 07 October 2019 at the latest.

Inclusive play equipment in Martlesham

The Parish Council is considering the need for inclusive play equipment within the parish, particularly at the Centenary Playspace. We would like to hear from you if this is something you would be particularly interested in for your children and what sort of equipment you would like to see installed.

Suffolk Coastal Local Plan Examination

An Inspector has been appointed by the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government to examine the soundness of the Local Plan, which sets out the level of growth needed in Suffolk Coastal, where it should be located and how it should be delivered, up to 2036. All the documents can be found on the East Suffolk Council website:

This is of particular significance to the parish

because of the inclusion of the Suffolk Police HQ site for 300 houses and the Woodbridge Town Football Club site in the north of the parish for 120 dwellings. The Parish Council will be making written representations to the Inspector and attending Hearings.

Ipswich Northern Route Public Consultation

The public consultation on the proposed routes for the northern relief road runs until 13 September 2019. East Suffolk Council and Ipswich Borough Council are exploring options to create a new road to enable better journeys across Suffolk as well as enable future growth. Each of the 3 options could have a significant impact on traffic through Martlesham on the A12 so please make your comments known! All information is available via www.ipswichnorthernroute.org.uk . Consultation launches on the county's Green Access Strategy

Communities are being invited to have their say on the Green Access Strategy - Rights of Way Improvement Plan as part of a ten-week consultation held by Suffolk County Council (SCC).

The county council, under the Countryside and Rights of Way Act (2000) is required to put together this plan which identifies changes that will improve rights of way provision for walkers, cyclists, horse riders and those with mobility problems.

The plan, which looks at rights of way access up until 2026, details why green access is so relevant to Suffolk's population and its visitors, and it focuses on how green access can benefit quality of life. SCC built the strategy on previous work, research and engagement with a range of consultees, such as the Suffolk Local Access Forum, parish councils, local businesses, landowners, users and non-user groups.

The public consultation opened on the 8th July 2019 and runs until Friday 20th September. The consultation will provide the council with final feedback before the plan is presented to cabinet later this year.

Councillor Mary Evans, Suffolk County Council's Cabinet Member for Highways, Transport and Rural Issues said; "The Green Access Strategy represents our commitment as a council to make the very most of the rights of way network and to provide our residents, our business community and our visitors an array of different and innovative opportunities to use, enjoy and benefit from green access."

Our annual glow worm survey and bat walk took place at the end of June, attended by 11 people. Disappointingly, only 6 female glow worms were spotted, and no males, but still exciting for those who had never seen one before. We were lucky to see, and hear with bat detectors, pipistrelle bats flying around the trees hunting for insects, and at times only just above our heads. Noctule bats were heard but not seen.

The volunteers this month added more bark chippings to some of the worst areas of the paths to keep them from getting overly muddy during wet weather, and rebuilt a section of the path that had started to collapse into the northern revetment's trench.





MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP

The heathland of Martlesham Heath is particularly able to support a range of butterflies as there is a great mix of vegetation including heather, gorse, grassland and trees with areas of short vegetation that suit many butterflies. These butterfly species include a nationally rare species, the Silver Studded Blue butterfly that uses heather as its food plant.

This year the Silver Studded blue butterflies on our heath emerged relatively late compared with last year. The hot spring weather seems to bring forward their emergence whereas cool wet weather such as we experienced in late April/May this year seems to push back their emergence. They could be seen in small numbers on our heath in the area of heather to the north of the boundary fence from late June through into early July. Several years ago they occurred across more areas further northwards on our heath, where currently they are absent. Our ongoing management work is aimed at producing a greater area of the heather and other ground conditions they require, hopefully to encourage them to spread northwards. Many thanks to those who helped count these butterflies this year. The total number counted looks substantially down on last year. A disappointing result given the improvement in numbers last year. There is much still to learn about the natural history of all butterflies and especially butterflies like the Silver Studded Blue which has a particularly complex natural history.

Our next work party will be on Sunday 4th August at 10am. Please meet on the ridge bank that runs east-west across the SSSI. We will work on bracken clearance.

Bracken is poor for conservation purposes as unfortunately it only supports a narrow range of wildlife in part due its toxic nature but also it has the ability to smother other underlying plants. The dwarf shrub layer of heather and grassland that it may have replaced is much more productive in comparison, supporting a wide range of invertebrates and higher animals (birds, reptiles, and mammals such as rabbits). Consequently it is important to reduce the extent and coverage of bracken in order to promote more heather and grassland to the benefit of a wider range of wildlife. Bracken continues to dominate in some areas of our heath although we have had some success in pushing it back in other areas due to an ongoing regime of cutting and spraying.

In August look out for Grayling butterflies, these are a typical butterfly of dry sandy heathland relying on sparsely growing fine grasses such as Sheep's Fescue with plenty of bare ground in open positions. Several areas of the heath were scraped to help promote similar conditions. You may also see the second emergence of several other butterflies including the Common Blue and Brown Argus butterflies.

MARTLESHAM HEATH AVIATION SOCIETY

On Friday July 5th we had our monthly meeting in the Community Hall. Bob Collis is an aviation historian and author who lives at Lowestoft and the subject of his talk was, "Zeppelins Over Lowestoft - Great War Raids on the East Coast Town. Bob was accompanied by two friends who are also aviation enthusiasts.

The Zeppelin was an enormous dirigible 600ft long which was filled with hydrogen gas bags to give them lift and usually had a crew of 22 men. Lowestoft was one of many towns which received visits from the then invincible Zeppelin. They carried a bomb load of 50kg bombs.

Bob showed many photographs taken at the time of the damage caused. We had no answer to the Zeppelin until 1916 because the standard BE2 fighter which was deployed on home defence was incapable of climbing to the height at which the Zeppelin flew. By 1916 we had developed aircraft which were capable of taking on the German "terror weapon", as it was called in those days. We also developed incendiary bullets which set fire to the gas. The crew invariably perished in the conflagration.

Gt Yarmouth was the first town to receive a visit from a Zeppelin. This was January 1915 and it was not until June 1917 that the Germans stopped using Zeppelins. By then we had the answer to them.

A vote of thanks was given by our chairman, Martyn Cook.

We have no meeting next month. It is usual to replace a meeting with an all day visit. On 2nd August a coach load of members and friends will visit the Mosquito museum at Salisbury Hall before going on to visit the RAF museum at Hendon.

The underground Battle HQ next to the Mill Farm development was a relic of WW2 and was built in 1941. It has recently been in the news because a cat found its way into the sealed bunker and was rescued. The bunker is one of many WW2 relics of RAF Martlesham Heath still to be found and a full story appears on the "news" page of our web site, www.mhas.org.uk.

MARTLESHAM AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF AIRBORNE RADAR

It is common knowledge that Bawdsey was the home of British radar development. This was for radar interception towers around the south and east coast of Britain to detect enemy aircraft.

It was also recognized that if radar could be installed in aircraft then they might be capable of tracking and destroying a hostile intruder. Martlesham was the nearest RAF Station to Bawdsey and also the home of the Aeroplane and Armament Experimental Establishment. It therefore supplied all the aircraft that were required for all aspects of radar development.

In the late summer of 1937 a Martlesham based Avro Anson flew took off quite unofficially to attempt to locate the British fleet which were sailing from the Straights of Dover to Scotland in an exercise to test the ability of the RAF and Coastal Command to locate them. Unknown to the crew of the Anson the exercise had been cancelled due to bad weather and aircraft, including flying boats from Felixstowe and Leuchars in the north, had all returned to base.

At 8am a large echo was detected and the Martlesham Anson homed in on it on the their primitive oscilloscope. It was the aircraft carrier Courageous and the cruiser Southampton together with attendant destroyers. The fleet were so concerned that aircraft from the Courageous were despatched to try and locate this unseen aircraft in the clouds. The Anson was also able to detect these aircraft in the air. The first air to air radar interception.

On returning to Martlesham, Coastal Operations at Bircham Newton were 'phoned and were stunned to hear that this Anson had located the ships by Range and Detection Finding, (later called Radar), in appalling weather and had been able to count them.

This caused tremendous commotions in the Air Ministry. Eminent scientists visited Martlesham to have this demonstrated to them. Among them was Sir Henry Tizzard, (Later chief scientific advisor to the Ministry of Defence). It was a nostalgic flight for him because he had chosen Martlesham Heath as the site for an aerodrome way back in 1916.

An aircraft took off and the person to whom it was being demonstrated could see the blip of the (oscilloscope), given by the pursued aircraft.

Professor Lindeman, (later Viscount Cherwell), was chief scientific advisor to Winston Churchill during WW2. He also visited Martlesham for a demonstration flight.

In 1935 the legendary Air Marshall Sir Hugh Dowding, commander in chief of Fighter Command had approved the first grant of £10000 for the development of airborne radar. He now also requested a demonstration flight.

Winston Churchill also visited Martlesham to have this new wonder discovery demonstrated to him. He was given a demonstration by a static aircraft on the perimeter track. The station Commander produced an elaborate silver tea service in the officers mess afterwards. Tea, exclaimed Churchill, Tea! - fetch me a brandy - a large one!

On the first day of WW2 Martlesham was home to about 10 experimental aircraft and 20 or more Bristol Blenheims which were being equipped with this Mk 1 Radar. The whole of "D" Flight, as the radar research unit was called, including all the aircraft were hurriedly flown to Dundee.

In the middle of all this frantic activity a stream of 10 trucks appeared. They were laden with soot and proceeded to spread it over the airfield. This was laughingly called airfield camouflage. Soon everyone looked like coal miners. One wonders what the ladies of Deben Avenue thought as they hung out their washing!

In 1940 scientists from Birmingham university produced the cavity magnetron. This was capable of providing radar equipment of much reduced size and the era of Radar development at Bawdsey and Martlesham came to an end.
