

This quince can be found in Bright's Orchard, located opposite Gorseland Primary School and Nursery and the nearby Aviation Museum at the Control Tower.

A quince is a small round pear shaped fruit, usually ready to be harvested in October or November.

Quince fruit is hard, astringent and bitter when raw but versatile when used in cooking and in particular, great for making jellies, jams and other preserves.

Bright's Orchard, a Martlesham Council Community initiative, is well worth a visit at this time of year when many of the trees bear blossom.

There are several varieties to discover; apples, plums, medlars, damsons as well as quince, all interesting and certainly fruit you are unlikely to find in our local shops and supermarkets.

# Martlesham Council

#### **Biodiversity**

Under the 2021 Environment Act, public authorities including town and parish councils must consider what they can do to conserve and enhance biodiversity, agree policies and specific objectives based on their consideration and act to deliver their policies and achieve their objectives.

National Hedgerow Week, one of the Tree Council's seasonal campaigns, will be celebrated this month (6th-12th May 2024).

Hedgerows are often the unsung heroes of the British countryside, they form the UK's largest wildlife habitat, are a major part of our landscape and cultural heritage and are crucial to halting biodiversity decline and tackling climate change.

Martlesham Council embraces the importance of hedgerows and in March, the Martlesham tree wardens ordered and planted two areas of hedging at the Recreation Ground. All the plants selected were native species and sourced locally.

A dog rose hedge was planted just in front of the pumping station and a further section of native mixed hedging was planted near to the Bowls Club. The cost of the plants was covered by a grant from the Tree Council.

At the end of March, the Council also heard that they had received a grant of £9,700 from the East Suffolk Council Kesgrave, Rushmere St Andrew, Martlesham, Carlford and Fynn Valley Community Partnership. We were delighted to be awarded this grant which was the result of a team effort involving Council staff, councillors and the Recreation Ground and Kroniis Piece Steering Group. The Council is looking forward to using the money to facilitate a sensory area which forms part of its Biodiversity, Enhancement and Accessibility in Martlesham, 'BEAM' project.

A reminder that Martlesham Council is running a wildlife friendly garden competition to be judged in November. Prizes, kindly provided by Martlesham in Bloom, will be awarded at our next volunteer evening towards the end of this year. Further details of that evening will



be forwarded to our volunteers and prize winners nearer the time.

As the days are getting longer, May is an ideal time to get out into the garden to take some photos for your competition entry. You may submit up to three photos per person per month if you wish.

During the month of May, consider leaving some grassy areas long to help pollinators and encourage nectar-rich plants such as clover.

Look out for the arrival of swifts in Martlesham this month and report any sightings to Martlesham Council. We will be turning on our own swift calling system very soon to help encourage swifts to visit the Council's boxes. In the last couple of decades, swift numbers have dropped by around 50%. If we can make our gardens and community spaces insect friendly, this will help feed good numbers of young.

# Summer edibles and preparing for summer

Now it is May gardens are bursting with growth to enjoy, and we seem to be hurtling towards summer! If you have been growing summer plants from seed and you have strong growing seedlings you can pot them up into small pots if you have not done so already. Once settled into them and growing start putting them outside during the day and bringing them back under cover at night for a couple of weeks to get them used to outdoor conditions; a process called hardening off. Beware of the temptation to plant out summer bedding too early because in May we may still get cold snaps! Beginning of June is safest.

It is a great time to start growing some tender (ie do not like cold weather) edible additions to your summer garden, whether in borders or containers. Beans are a wonderful addition; French climbing and Runner beans will provide a tasty harvest with French climbing and runner beans often flowering and producing beans for months and looking particularly ornamental with their flowers on twining stems. You can start them all indoors, sowing one or two seeds per small pot or module in a tray then keep them in a propagator or on a warm windowsill where they will germinate and start to grow. If you sow some, wait then sow more you will have plants of different ages on the go, maximising your opportunity for a succession of harvests

It is not too late to sow tomato seeds, they will just flower and fruit a little later in the season than plants sown earlier. Sow them in small pots, modules or trays in warm conditions, like the beans, then pot into single pots once seedlings have several leaves ready to plant out a few weeks later in summer. There is a wide choice of tomato varieties including hanging ones for containers and hanging baskets.

The other winners with these edibles are pollinators, in particular bumblebees who will visit their flowers and pollinate them, they gain the pollen and nectar, and you gain with the subsequent harvest!



#### Martlesham Conservation Group

Many thanks to all those who attended our last work party when we created small patches of bare ground for the benefit of solitary bees and wasps, reptiles, butterflies and some birds that like to eat seeds off the ground. These bare patches should gradually be colonised by fresh new heather plants too. We were also fortunate to discover two young adders in the midst of the area we were working in. Adders have been seen across the heath in good numbers and so dog owners are advised to take care and keep their dogs on a lead as this action could avoid unnecessary distress or injury.

The birdlife on the heath picked up during March and April with the arrival of several migrants. Chiff Chaffs appeared in mid March, with some Blackcaps a little later and Nightingales about 10th April. On the warmer days a few butterflies appeared, including Brimstone, Comma, Peacock, Small Tortoiseshell, Orange Tip and Green Hairstreak . Buzzards are seen regularly drifting across the sky with occasional appearances of Kestrels and Peregrine falcons (these have been nesting on the BT site for several years) and Red Kites. Throughout May butterfly species should appear in greater numbers including the Green Hairstreak butterfly a heathland species that relies on gorse as its food plant, the wandering Orange Tip, and Speckled Wood. As for other birds, hopefully our heath and woodland will resound again to that prolific songbird the Nightingale especially at night, whilst other species including migrants such as Garden Warbler, Whitethroat and Lesser Whitethroat add to the soundscape during the day. We may also be fortunate to hear the beautiful song of the woodlark on the common and heath as we have been able to do in previous years.

For our work party in May we will be undertaking a walk around the wood to the south of the green on Martlesham Heath on Sunday12th May starting at 10am. We will try to identify the bird species present by sight and song. Please meet outside the Douglas Bader PH and bring a pair of binoculars if you have them. You may be interested in taking part in our work parties or wildlife surveys please contact us and please let us know if you have any interesting wildlife observations. We will return to the heath for practical work on Sunday 2nd June at 10am when we will be cutting bracken.

The whole idea of the Suffolk Repair Shed is to reduce the amount going to landfill. Now you may think that that would involve the kind of stuff you see at the tip in the small appliances section. Toasters, vacuum cleaners (don't tell them your name, Dyson!) CD players etc. And for the most part you would be right as the picture shows.

But now and again someone comes in with something which they really love, and which would never ever go to landfill while the original owner has anything to do with it. We aren't in The Repair Shop territory here; these items often have no value beyond sentimental, and generally there is no back story to satisfy the needs of a reality TV show. people here can't resist a challenge. So off we go down rabbit-holes which are by any measure complete nonsense. There's an "Ice-ice Baby" snowman who gets a new 3d printed gear, because "my wife thinks it's funny".

"Would you like to look at this reed organ I've been given?" "The head has fallen off my metal dog." "I've got this old guitar amp to fix....." And so it goes on.

Jobs like this provide some diversion from the norm, and sometimes take an inordinate amount of time. So it's lucky we are not for profit! But it's probably inherent in the nature of the people here that curiosity sometimes overcomes common sense, and in some ways that's the best bit. Because provide a space where we can share tall stories, experience and skills. Maybe you should try it.





# MARTLESHAM HEATH AVIATION SOCIETY

On Friday 5th April we welcomed Terry Holloway who, amongst other things, mentioned his love of Gliding.

Terry's introduction to gliding, as a teenager, was to fly in gliders like the tandem seat T31 Glider, (flown by many Air Cadets between 1951 and 1986) – and flown from Martlesham Heath until the Airfield closed in 1963. Terry first flew from Christchurch and then other airfields like Bicester.

He briefly went through the history of gliding and mentioned that the Germans were not allowed to operate military aircraft between the wars – but , as war looked increasingly likely they encouraged teenagers to fly in similar Gliders. Many of these young glider pilots later formed the core of the Luftwaffe. Similar gliders were also flown by the RAF Air Cadets, and for civilian gliding enthusiasts in Great Britain

The Glider became very useful in the 2nd World War, with (perhaps unsurprisingly) Germans using troop carrying Gliders to bypass Belgian defences – crossing canals that were one of the Belgian's chief defensive lines.

Terry then talked about modern gliders and how sophisticated they have become. They now contain instruments that help the pilots find Thermals (rising columns of air) and others indicate how fast the Glider is rising (or falling) as it soars.

Terry had always had an ambition to fly a glider over the highest mountain in Chile, Mount Aconagua.... which is 21,000 feet high.The Chilean Airforce was looking for some new gliders – Terry had a look around, and using his contacts managed to source 5 Cessna C172 Gliders, for around £70,000 each. If he wanted new ones they would cost about £270,000 each.

So the adventure started.The RAF already had very close contacts with the Chilean

Air Force, and Terry and his team of RAF pilots went with the Gliders to train the Chilean's fly the new gliders.

They flew from a Chilean Air Force station at Santiago, the Gliders being towed launched by a Cessna Bird Dog light aircraft.

It is not easy to fly Gliders in this area, as close to the Andes, weather and thermals are very unpredictable. Terry said there are about 253 missing planes that have crashed somewhere in the Andes range. For all its dangers, the terrain is fascinating.

After some practice flights their five new gliders with mixed RAF and Chilean Air Force Crews all got used to flying above the unforgiving terrain.

At last success. Because of the height they were aiming to fly at, they all had to wear oxygen masks – and take special precautions to avoid frost-bite. The could not even take sandwiches with them – as the temperature dropped to about -40C and the sandwiches froze solid. They warded off altitude sickness by drinking lots of CoCo Tea!

They celebrated with a riotous party.

Terry went on to talk about some other aircraft adventures and career. On leaving the RAF he became Engineering Officer at Marshall's Aerospace at Cambridge Airfield. He still works for them – but not full time.

Despite being ground based at Marshall's he managed to have flights in Lightning and Hawker Hunter Jet Fighters, as well as taking the control in Carolyn Grace's Two Seat Spitfire, as well as flights in De Havilland Tiger Moths. For many years he owned a rare De Havilland "Puss Moth". He has now flown in well over two hundred different aircraft.

The Evening was really fascinating – and we look forward to keeping up our contact with Terry.




