



MARTLESHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Happy Christmas! We wish our parishioners a peaceful time and best wishes for the year ahead.

We have a full Council!

We were very pleased to welcome Sarah-Joy Maddeaux to the Council in November. This means we now have a full team of 15 councillors, all doing their best to keep Martlesham a great place to live. Sarah-Joy is keen to make Martlesham a healthy, sustainable, active community & is passionate about protecting the beautiful natural spaces we have in our parish and encouraging respectful use of them by all residents.

Martlesham Trim Trail

This is now up and running! We hope you all received your leaflet last month but, if you didn't, please contact the office or find it on our website.

Cuts to Martlesham bus services

On 29 October we hosted a meeting of 13 town & parish councils in East Suffolk, chiefly on the A1214/A12 corridor, with the Managing Director of First Essex, Norfolk & Suffolk and the Network Manager of First Eastern Counties. The parish councils are joining together, following the major cuts to our bus services, to try and achieve a new Local Bus Strategy.

A new Bus Strategy is a long-term vision. Three short term proposals were put forward with a view to addressing some more immediate concerns which would benefit all the parishes in some way:

- Reinstate the 800 service to go along Main Road to establish a service to and from Ipswich, Woodbridge and Rendlesham.
- Reinstate a full service for Martlesham Heath, and other housing areas in Woodbridge and Kesgrave.
- Compensate for or retain subsidised bus service 71, due to be cut on 01 November

As part of any changes, we have strongly made the case for rerouting the buses from the old Felixstowe Road, where there are no bus stops, to Main Road, then to Tesco via the A12.

This was acknowledged to be a 'big ask' by First who are need of new revenue streams to make the services work.

It was noted that the parish councils present

represented a population of over 46,000 and there are things that they could do to promote the buses, such as advertising, providing timetables, encouraging parishioners to get out of their cars but it would only work if the services are more attractive & there are incentives to do so. The Parish Council has agreed to earmark in principle £500 to the promotion of the bus services but this expenditure is dependent on how we can work with the local authorities and bus companies to make improvements.

We continue to have concerns about the 66A route & are well aware that we may lose it as the use has dropped, unsurprisingly as the old timetables have remained in place, there have been problems with reliability, and Tesco is missed out. We continue to work on this.

Hot off the press (EADT): "A new 71 service from 18 November will serve a number of rural villages including Orford, Butley, Capel St Andrew, Boyton, Hollesley and Sutton Heath before stopping at Melton, Woodbridge and Martlesham where customers will be able to get connecting buses to Ipswich." Unfortunately, we have no further details at the moment.

Speeding traffic

Many of you have reported issues with speeding traffic on Main Road, Martlesham and around Eagle Way to the Traffic Watch group, which the Council supports. As a result, agreement has now been made to purchase a mobile Speed Indicator Display Unit (SID) which can be moved around key locations. Trained volunteers will be able to set it up. The aim is not only to educate speeding drivers but also to collect traffic data which will inform our policy decisions and aid discussions with the Highways authority and developers.

We will be looking to tap into external sources of funding for the SID.

Recreation Ground & Kronji's Piece - Work Party 19.10.19

Mr Prime, who was our councillor representative on the day of the Work Party reports,

"It was great to see how many people turned up to the working party.

All parties turned up with gloves and tools in hand ready for 4 hours of fun and hard work! We managed to make some good progress with some key wildlife areas and at the same time all learnt some new key skills in how we were all helping to protect and enhance the wildlife in the area.

Next year we are going to increase the publicity for the event hoping to attract more help and also engage some of the younger people living in the area."

Many thanks go to Neil Lister, Countryside Projects Officer for Suffolk Coast & Heaths AONB (Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty), who led the group, and to the Bowls Club who opened up the clubhouse for refreshments.

Community Orchard Exhibition

We are pleased that this has led to new volunteers coming forward, some useful feedback and an offer of help from Hacheston, where an orchard is already established. Everything is still on course for a spring 2020 phase one planting.

CHRIS BLUNDELL'S DISTRICT COUNCILLOR REPORT DECEMBER 2019

A New General Election. This is a distraction from the normal business of the East Suffolk Council since it is their responsibility to administer the election. I believe that this was probably the most sensible outcome from such a long drawn out problem. As your Conservative District Councillor I believe that you will understand where my sympathies will lie. So, it is a case of wait and see what the outcome is and hope that it is not another 'Hung Parliament'

The East Suffolk Partnership Scheme. The first Partnership Workshop took place on 29th October 2019 at Kesgrave Memorial Centre. You will recall from my last report that the local area that was considered included Kesgrave, Rushmere St Andrews, Carlford & Fynn Valley and Martlesham & Purdis Farm (i.e. four adjacent wards). The consensus outcome by that group was that there should be a 'Reduction in Social Isolation' as their first choice. Second was 'Environmental Care/Sustainable Transport followed a joint third choice of 'Traffic and Road Safety' along with 'Support people to Age Well' (e.g. Health / Activities / Money.

When all eight area Partnership workshop meetings have been concluded there will be a Partnership Board Meeting to review all the area's priorities and a decision will be made on where best to allocate the £10k in each area to have the best effect in the current Financial year. I will let you know the decision when it has been decided

Finally, I will take this opportunity to wish everyone a Happy Christmas when we remember the birth that took place over 2000 years ago. Also, I wish everyone to have a joyful new year celebration and that good health and prosperity will come for all our residents.

MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP

The autumn and winter period is a time of increased practical conservation work as all the nesting activities of birds has been completed and it is possible to remove vegetation whilst minimising the impact on wildlife. The Conservation group intends to be active on a number of tasks. Over the same period contractors are likely to be working on the heath SSSI for periods of a few days at a time. Several of these work tasks may involve the use of mechanised equipment. Please watch out for them and us and take care for your own safety as you walk around the heath.

Please join us for our next work party on Sunday 1st December at 10 am on the heath SSSI (western corridor) up near the northern end close to the previous bonfire site (more or less opposite where the path comes in from the gate near the windsock on Eagle Way). We will be working to cut back the scrubby vegetation for the benefit of the wildlife and public. All tools and instructions will be provided on the day.

You may attract more wildlife into your garden over autumn and winter by being a little less tidy. For example you could help a hedgehog to endure the winter months by leaving some vegetation to provide shelter. Please let autumn leaves rot where they fall or rake them in to piles. Please leave areas uncut over winter and always check for hedgehogs whenever you cut long grass or bramble. Also a number of bird species will join us from colder climates to the north over the winter period; the heath had several visitors over the winter period in previous years such as Stonechat, Dartford Warblers, Redwings, and Fieldfares; even familiar species such as Blackbirds could have migrated from a considerable distance. Please spare a thought for our wild birds and remember to put out food and water in your gardens and leave berries on bushes to help them through the cold spells.

MARTLESHAM HEATH AVIATION SOCIETY

Friday November 1st and we were entertained with an illustrated talk by one of our own hon. vice presidents'. Clive Stevens is an authority on the USAAF in England during WW2. The knowledge of his subject is impressive.

Clive explained that from 1942 until the end of WW2 we were virtually "invaded" by American servicemen intent on helping us defeat Nazi Germany. He concentrated on the USAAF 8th Air Force, but the American 9th Air Force were also in England. Essex in particular was the home of the 9th Air Force whilst Suffolk, Norfolk and Cambridgeshire, and Northamptonshire in particular was where the USAAF 8th Air Force bombers were based. They flew the heavily armed B17 "Flying Fortresses" and the Consolidated B24 "Liberator" bombers. The USAAF included airfields, such as RAF Martlesham Heath which was one of many bases from which flew the fighters that escorted the bombers.

The Americans doggedly stuck to high altitude daylight bombing and as with the RAF night bombing campaign, their losses were high.

During WW2 some two million American servicemen passed through England and up to half a million were based, mostly in East Anglia to man and maintain the USAAF.

During the second half of the evening Clive talked about the attempts to reclaim much of what had been hurriedly buried in the vicinity of the many bases.

A vote of thanks was given by our president, Richard Barker.

Our meeting in December is on Friday, 6th December and will feature another old friend of our society. Ken Ellis is a former editor of "Flypast" magazine and aviation author. The subject will be "The De Havilland" story. This should be an evening not to miss!



The future of the Community Hall and Richards Room relies on volunteers to share the work load, bring forward new ideas, generate funding via grant applications to meet our aspirations to improve facilities. I have served on the committee since 1987 and will seek nomination as chairman at the AGM in April 2020. However, at the AGM in April 2021 I shall not put my name forward to serve on the committee. We have a vibrant working building complex serving the community, long may it remain.
