Following the appointment of Michael Calver, we still have one casual vacancy for a councillor. Please join our Council to help us look after our land and assets, improve facilities, engage with other authorities on planning and highways matters and decide how the precept (parish council tax) will be spent. Training is available, costs covered by us, and our experienced councillors are also happy to mentor. Councillors cannot be paid and do not receive any allowances but they may claim reasonable expenses. Our website is a good place to find out what we do.

The term of office for current councillors ends next May 2019 when an election will take place on Thursday 02 May. Therefore it is likely that the last time that the Council will consider co-option before these elections is at the full Council meeting on Wednesday 07 November 2018 at 7.30pm, in the Parish Room, Felixstowe Road IP12 4PB. There is no full Council meeting in December.

# Martlesham Common Local Nature Reserve – support from Councillor O'Brien

You will see elsewhere in the newsletter an article on the Tesco Bags of Help & read about our initiatives to protect the wildlife on The Common but also to make it an open space which can be enjoyed more by all. Display boards are one part of our project but we also plan to install 'framed entrances'. The new entrances will define the recently designated Local Nature Reserve and help manage access across the site which has

increased with the completion of Mill Heath. The 10 entrances will be made up of post and rail fencing either side of a gap (a rustic version of the fencing sometimes seen at the entrance to villages) maintaining easy access for pedestrians, those with buggies etc. The project which includes signs for the site will be undertaken by the Greenways Project. We are very pleased to announce that County Councillor Patricia O'Brien is supporting this project with £1,200 of funding from her locality budget. We also have plans to improve the paths.

### Sports Fund Project (Money to Play With) – Trim Trail Update

Following meetings with providers of exercise stations in October, we are now reviewing their quotes and recommendations.

Information on this exciting project will be updated on our website, address below.

#### Potential sale and redevelopment of Police Headquarters (HQ), Martlesham

Following a public exhibition in June at Martlesham Heath Pavilion, the Police & Crime Commissioner (PCC), Tim Passmore, is continuing to consider the potential sale of the Police HQ site for housing. In October the Council was invited to a feedback meeting on the results of the consultation. The key themes identified by respondents to the consultation were: traffic, highways & access; local infrastructure capacity; level of development in the area; wildlife/ environment; project economics; neighbour/ community amenity; ideas for the site - other options; and impact on police services/police staff. Please see the PCC's website, www.suffolk-pcc.gov.uk, for up to date information and next steps for developing their plans further.

The Parish Council sent a letter of objection to the PCC in July opposing development for housing on a number of grounds. The primary objection is that this is not land allocated for housing in the Martlesham Neighbourhood Plan or the Suffolk Coastal Local Plan for good reasons.

#### **Retail Park developments**

You may have noticed work commencing to clear the land near the BT roundabout. This is preparation for the ALDI store which received planning permission earlier this year.

#### **Brightwell Lakes development**

Further plans have been posted on the Suffolk Coastal District Council (SCDC) website, www.eastsuffolk.gov.uk, including a new design for the entrance. SCDC is likely to consider these at its Planning Committee's meeting on 18 October 2018. Work is now unlikely to start before early next year.

#### CHRIS BLUNDELL'S DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT FOR NOVEMBER 2018

**More on the Green Waste Bins.** There was a very good response to the Garden Waste Scheme, with approximately 33,500 households signed up to the program and 80% of those who signed up have opted for the larger bins. The rollout of the new bins began during the first week of October 2018, and since it is quite a large logistic exercise it is taking over a month to deliver the new bins to all who have requested them. Also about a month after residents receive their new garden waste bins the team will return to collect any unwanted brown bins. Residents will be informed when these pick ups are happening nearer the time.

Awards for Planning excellence. Suffolk Coastal District Council's high quality planning department has been recognised by receiving two top awards. In fact Suffolk Coastal made a clean sweep at the prestigious Royal Town Planning Institute's East of England (RTPI) awards for planning excellence. The award for 'Planning Excellence' was awarded to Suffolk Coastal District Council and Commercial Estates Group (CEG), from a short list of 10 submissions, for Brightwell Lakes. The second award for the Young Planner of the Year was awarded to Ben Woolnough, Major Projects Advisor in Suffolk Coastal's Planning Department who worked on the Brightwell lakes project.

#### JOHN KELSO'S DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORT

#### Update on the Suffolk Police plan to build 250 houses at their H.Q.

On Tuesday 9th of October Local District Councillors, Martlesham Parish Council and Kesgrave Town Council representatives were invited to attend an update meeting on the Police proposal to sell the H.Q. site at Portal Avenue to allow for the proposed building of 250 houses

Residents may recall the exhibition that was held at the Pavilion on the 18th of June. Over 300 of you took the trouble to attend and to give your opinion on the potential development of the site.

At the meeting held in October it appears that the Police intend to proceed to produce a planning application for the site without any major changes to the document that was on display at the exhibition.

I was informed at the update meeting that no pre-application meetings have been held with the Suffolk Coastal Planning Department (SCPD) and that no contact has been made with the covenant holders.

I believe that the original land sale document for part of this site includes a covenant that requires the Police to pay some costs to the original owner if the land was ever resold. This may or may not affect the viability of this sale.

It should also be noted that our recently adopted Neighbourhood Plan (NP) does not envisage the need for any large scale development within its area apart from Brightwell Lakes (Adastral Park).

The Suffolk Coastal Local Plan first draft July2018 which recently undertook a consultation, which ended in September states: For the East of Ipswich, as the Brightwell Lakes development is proposed to come forward during the plan period, no further major growth is planned. However, it is expected that some small scale development will come forward within the settlement boundaries in accordance with Policy SCLP3.4. (This document may be amended before final adoption which is hoped to be in 2019)

Mr Passmore , Police and Crime Commissioner is expecting the planning application to arrive at the SCPD before the end of this year. More information is available at the Suffolk Police website www.suffolk-pcc.gov.uk . I will keep you updated on any developments. 

We are now into the 'stormy' weather season and we want remind residents to always act cautiously when accessing the woodland areas during adverse weather conditions. We also ask that residents always report any wind damage that may have occurred during stormy weather.

#### **MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP**

In October we began our autumn and winter cycle of scrub clearance on the heath by cutting out small trees and gorse from an area of heather in the south west part of the Martlesham Heath SSSI. Thanks go to all the volunteers who came along to our work party. We plan to continue the work in a similar area at our work party in November, which will take place on Sunday November 18th at 10:00 am. There will be more work through the winter at our monthly work parties that will also be complemented by the professional work undertaken on behalf of Martlesham Heath SSSI Ltd. Why not consider coming along to one of our work parties in order to manage this special landscape and wildlife?

Over the last year we undertook various surveys including birds in the woodland, and butterflies on the heath. The Silver Studded Blue butterflies seem to have been more abundant in comparison to last year. Please come and join us for our AGM on Friday November 23rd at 7:45pm in the Parish Room on Old Felixstowe Road when we will discuss the results of our surveys in more detail as well as other aspects of our local wildlife.

Looking ahead we may get colder weather through the winter, please try leaving some piles of twigs and other organic material out in your gardens as a refuge for wildlife including small mammals such as hedgehogs. But please do not disturb these piles until we are well into the warmer weather of spring. Also look out for winter migrant birds on our heaths, woodlands and gardens. Last year these included Stonechat and Dartford Warbler and visitors from further afield such as Redwings.



# PCC updates local community on potential redevelopment of the Police HO site. Martlesham

Following a period of public consultation held in the summer, the Police and Crime Commissioner for Suffolk (PCC) is providing the local community with an update on the potential sale of the Martlesham Police Headquarters site for residential development.

The sale is being considered as part of a full review of the PCC's estate, in order to help reduce costs and provide better value for money to taxpayers, without impacting on police services or jobs. If it goes ahead, the HQ would move to more fit-for-purpose premises in the Ipswich area, which are likely to be existing public sector buildings.

In order to know what the value of the HQ site is, and therefore determine whether it should be sold, the PCC appointed a team of consultants who have carried out a range of technical studies. This has suggested that around 250 homes could be built on the site, should planning permission be granted by Suffolk Coastal District Council in the future.

A public exhibition was held in June at Martlesham Heath Pavilion, which over 300 people attended. The PCC received feedback from 164 local people, stakeholders and organisations. An update leaflet, available on the PCC website, provides details of the key themes of the feedback - which include traffic, local infrastructure and wildlife – and how these are being considered by the project team as the plans continue to be finalised.

Police and Crime Commissioner for Suffolk, Tim Passmore, said, "We are very grateful to everyone who came along to the exhibition and to all those who took the time to feedback to us on the draft plans. I'm really pleased so many people took part in the consultation. We've had a lot to think about and the plans are still evolving.

"We've put together the leaflet to provide an update and address some of the key points raised by local residents and staff. We will continue to keep people updated and we hope to submit an outline planning application by the end of the year."

All the feedback received will be detailed in a Statement of Community Consultation, which will be submitted with the planning application to Suffolk Coastal District Council.

If planning permission were to be granted, valuations would then be obtained to assess if it were viable to relocate the Police Headquarters elsewhere in the Ipswich area. The site could then be considered for sale to a house builder or developer who would draw up more detailed designs and submit a further planning application for approval before any work could start.

#### Martlesham Parish Council calls for votes to bag a share of Tesco's bag fund

Martlesham Parish Council is bidding to bag a massive cash boost from the Tesco Bags of Help Scheme, and we need your help! We are one of three groups in this region that have been shortlisted to receive a cash award and shoppers are being invited to vote for who they think should take away the top grant.

The aim of our project is to erect 3 information boards on Martlesham Common (a recently designated Local Nature Reserve), informing visitors about the valuable heathland habitat. In doing so, we hope to encourage an understanding and respect for the site, so that all can enjoy it for years to come, whilst protecting the natural wildlife.

Increased pressure from the recent housing development on the site's northern border and the growth of the nearby retail park is taking its toll on the area. This will be exacerbated by the development of 2000 homes at Adastral Park less than a mile away over the next decade. New unplanned paths created by more people walking across the site have fragmented this small site, and dog faeces and litter are an increasing problem. The information boards will raise the profile of the site, highlighting its rare habitats and species including the Silver Studded Blue butterfly, its management and history. The signs will help develop the site's identity as currently there is no signage indicating its wildlife value.

Wally Welch, Chairman of the Martlesham Common Working Group, said: "Our aim is to spread the word about the rare and wonderful wildlife and the fascinating history of this Local Nature Reserve, to the many visitors. We aim to enhance it as an open space to enjoy, as well as protecting it for future generations."

#### What is this life if, full of care, we have no time to stand and stare? William Henry Davies.

Today I took a dog for a walk. Perhaps unremarkable in itself, and something that many of you will also have done. However, this was not my dog - I borrowed it. And we walked around Kesgrave High school grounds at lunchtime. It's part of a mental health project enabling students to pet an animal (which is good for reducing stress) and giving them someone to talk to who is outside of their everyday situation.

Worry and stress and business are, it seems, a part of our modern life, affecting not just teenagers but many others too. It sometimes seems that we wear them as a badge of pride - I'm busy and stressed so I must have worth. And standing against this tide of stress is Jesus whose words to us were 'Do not worry'.

Dallas Willard, an American theologian, was asked how he would describe Jesus in one word, and after pondering the question came back with this answer. Jesus was relaxed. So how can we follow that example, and not allow the business and stress to define us. How can we not worry?

Well there is no simple solution - otherwise I would be a millionaire stress relief guru and you wouldn't have worry issues. But perhaps we can take a few pointers from Jesus. He knew his identity was not in how others saw him, but as a child of God. A God who loves all of us and welcomes all of us. And Jesus knew - as we too can know that he could turn to God for support in the good times and in the bad. Perhaps there is something in there for us too?

In the bible there is a phrase that appears several times that has relevance to our lives today. God cares for you, so turn all your worries over to him (1 Peter 5:7). And then you too (and me!) can take the time to stop and stare and walk the dog and live a life free of worry and stress.

I pray that you will be able to take these words and know the God who cares for us all.
