Tree of the Month

Native Black Poplar (Populus nigra subsp. betulifolia)

This black poplar can be found near the water's edge at Martlesham Recreation Ground.

The leaves are shiny, green and heart-shaped with a mild scent of balsam.

The tree takes its name from its grey-brown bark, which, as it ages, often appears black, fissured, gnarled and covered with distinctive burrs.

According to the Woodland Trust, the native black poplar is now officially rarer in numbers than the giant panda.

The black poplar has separate male and female trees. It is estimated that there are only 7,000 black poplars left in the UK, of which 600 are female.

Brightwell Lakes Update

Members of Martlesham Council attended a Brightwell Lakes Community Forum meeting on 6th April. The Forum gives councillors from nearby parishes the opportunity to meet with the developers Taylor Wimpey, Concilio Communications, and members of the East Suffolk Council planning team to discuss the latest developments on site.

The April Community Forum considered a short list of 23 names compiled by the ESC officer who deals with place names. ESC has a list of street naming and numbering procedures, and naming protocols, available to view online at eastsuffolk.gov.uk. A decision was taken to call the main spine road, 'Auster', after the aircraft manufacturer. Auster aircraft has a long distinguished history starting with its formation as British Taylorcraft in 1938 and ending with its absorption into Beagle Aircraft in 1960.

Other names selected for phase one of the development were Armstrong, Blackburn, Siddeley, Tizard, Sherren, Morse, Hey, Philips, Stevens, Paterson, Hammond, Jones, Faraday and Babbage.

Housing phase E1 will consist of 122 dwellings in total, 36 being affordable. Building is expected to start in June 2023 with the first show home opening in November 2023 and the first legal completion taking place in May 2024.

Housing phase W1 will consist of 195 dwellings in total, 80 being affordable. The show open is expected to open in March 2024, with the first legal completion in November 2024.

Discussions at the next Forum in September are expected to centre round the provision of sports pitches, the school and the allotments.

We now have details from the developer regarding the expected delivery of new homes. By 2030, 647 homes are expected to have been completed and by 2040, 1647 homes. The full number of dwellings, (2000) will not be delivered until 2044.

Please don't forget if you have a dog to keep it on a lead and under close control when in the Local Nature Reserve. This is to ensure wildlife is not disturbed during this sensitive time of year.

MARTLESHAM IN BLOOM

Gardening for Pollinators and People

Early June is an ideal time to plant out tender flowering plants that you have bought or grown, such as cosmos, sunflowers, and fuchsia, to create a colourful display for summer in borders and containers. There are numerous different pollinators in the UK, from bees to beetles, moths, and flies. Whether you have a garden or just space for one container on your doorstep we can all help these declining creatures by providing some single flower forms in our displays, from which they can forage pollen and nectar. These are flowers where you can see the centre of the flower, the opposite to double flowers which are a mass of petals.

If you have been leaving some or all of your lawn long to allow flowers to bloom for pollinators during 'No More May', the campaign run by charity Plantlife, why not help them further by leaving part or all of it long for the rest of the summer.

All these areas, whether wildflowers in grass, or summer flowering plants in borders, window boxes or containers, link together into vital wildlife corridors, joining up with other pollinator and wildlife friendly areas, helping pollinators and other wildlife move from place to place.

Beautiful flowers also give us so much enjoyment, and if they are at the front of your property passers by can enjoy them too!

MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP

We have a good number of Nightingales out on the heath SSSI this year. They like the thicker more bushy vegetation, with the males giving vent to their complex and varied song from deep in a bush, which makes them difficult to see. They can get very loud especially if adjacent males are competing against each other to defend their territory. They will often sing through the night and large parts of the day too and can usually be heard singing through into early June but then go quiet. So listen out before the first week of June as this could be your last chance to experience this wonderful birdsong until next year.

Other migrant birds that have been making themselves heard include the Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Garden Warbler and Blackcap. The Blackcap also has a rather varied and beautiful song, not as rich and varied as the Nightingale, and with less harsh notes. We have also had a few interludes locally from that other celebrated migrant, the Cuckoo.

The colder wetter spring means that butterflies have been less evident, only being obvious on the warmer days. The bright yellow Brimstone, Orange Tip, multicoloured Peacock, Holly Blue, Small Copper and Green Hairstreak have appeared fleetingly on some of those warm days. By June, these earlier spring species disappear then late spring and summer species appear. Look out for Common Blue, Meadow Brown, Gatekeeper, three types of Skipper, Silver Studded Blue, and Purple Hairstreak. June can be an especially good month for butterflies and in some years it may be possible to see about 18 species on a single day out on the heath if conditions are favourable.

June should also see the emergence of the adult Silver Studded Blue butterflies on the heath; the caterpillars of these small blue butterflies use heather(and some other heathland plants) as their food plant but also involve small black ants in their lifecycle. Both need to be present for a successful colony. Later in the month or early in July we will attempt to count these butterflies on the heath SSSI and Common, please get in touch if you would like to be involved.

Our practical work party for June will be on **Sunday 4th June at 10am**. Please meet on the Martlesham Heath SSSI by the bank that runs east-west. We will begin work on controlling invasive bracken that threatens to choke out the heather and acid grassland that is more beneficial for a wide range of wildlife. Please contact me if you are interested in taking part in any of our work parties or wildlife surveys and please let us know if you have any interesting wildlife

Portal Woodlands Conservation Group

The volunteers also created a dead hedge from dismantled dens, and enjoyed seeing lovely displays of bluebells (*Hyacinthoides*) and examples of the unusual crown imperial (*Fritillaria imperialis*).

Martlesham Community Responders are a small group of volunteers who are trained to provide local emergency support to the East of England Ambulance Service. We are trained in First Aid and resuscitation, and living locally we can provide an initial response to many emergency 999 calls for the Martlesham area, and we can then assist the ambulance crew after their arrival.

E-coli in Martlesham Creek - Update

Following on from my letter to Dr Coffey detailed in last month's magazine, I went to a meeting (at her request) with her, Anglian Water and the Environment Agency down at Martlesham Creek. She agreed to write to Suffolk County Council Public Health on the need for warning signs. In discussion with Anglian Water, they told me that following the successful bid by the 'Save the Deben' group for bathing water status at Waldringfield, this should help unlock investment to treat the sewage discharged at both Martlesham Creek and Melton for pathogens like e-coli. Both sewage works don't do this currently as they are not required to (no nearby bathing water areas). They undertook to keep me updated so watch this space!

Martlesham Village Fete

We hope to see you at the fete (Saturday 15th July), where we will be available to talk to anyone concerned about the increasingly alarming climate emergency and what you can personally do to reduce your own carbon emissions. We will also have residents who have experience of investing in solar panels, battery systems or heat pumps if you are thinking of doing the same. Free general advice sheets will also be available.

Brights Orchard Progress Update June 2023

Community Orchard Working Group

Fruit for the local community:

Brights Orchard is a community orchard which has been established on the old Western Corridor football pitch (leased to the orchard free of charge by Martlesham Heath Householders Ltd) that is between the Control Tower and Gorseland CP School, by the Community Orchard Working Group (A Working Group of Martlesham Parish Council) and volunteers. A mixture of fruit trees have been planted since 2020, many varieties of which are not commonly found in shops. They include heritage varieties and some from East Anglia. The area is open access for the local community to pick the fruit when ready, for their personal use, with plaques by each tree giving information on use and harvest times.

Leisure, recreation and contemplation:

The site layout has been designed with areas of open space between groups of trees, and mown paths through and around the site, for people to be able to

continue to enjoy the location in different ways.

Wildlife:

The orchard is being managed to increase the wildlife on site, both in abundance and diversity, through not using chemicals and by managing the grass around the trees as a wildflower meadow; it is left long with an appropriate cutting regime to encourage native flowers and grasses indigenous to the local conditions to grow, helping not just the flora but fauna as well. This is especially important as the site is close to the Western Corridor SSSI and adds to the wildlife corridor. Since the maintenance plan began an increase in flora and fauna has been noticed.

Education:

The local volunteers, both adults and children, are learning about and furthering their understanding of orchards, trees, wildlife and related subjects through activities such as planting and watering. The plaques beside each tree give information about them and articles with information about the area are put in local magazines which reach the whole parish.

The orchard is named after Mr Frank Bright MBE, a Holocaust survivor who lives in Martlesham and received his MBE for services to Holocaust education - a connection which has and will continue to provide educational benefits.

Community involvement:

Volunteers, which includes the working group, individuals and Eco Warriors from Gorseland County Primary School, have and are helping with many aspects of the orchard, including planning, planting and watering and without the volunteers the orchard would not be here for everyone to enjoy so thank you to everyone who has helped and is continuing to help.

Would you like to be involved with Brights Orchard? At the moment volunteers are taking turns watering the most recently planted trees - would you like to help?



The Annual Associate Members Report to the Society Members took place on Friday, 5th May, the 42nd such event.

Some key points follow.....

Our long serving Chairman, Martyn Cook, went over the events of the year. He mentioned the sad death last October of our President, Richard Barker, who had been a staunch supporter of the Society for many years. He is sadly missed – and will be hard to replace.

Martyn then mentioned two other members of the team who are standing down.

Alan Powell has been Secretary and Website Manager for many years – and also Editor of our regular "Runway 22" members newsletter since before 1997. He has also been a useful contact point for people for around the world to contact the Society with questions and information – some of which ended up in our newsletter. The hunt is on to find a successor – which will be difficult...... Alan was thanked for the hard work he has done for the Society and we wished him well for the future.

Peter Morris, catering manager for our monthly meetings – has stepped down and will also be much missed.

However, we have been delighted to welcome new members onto our team over the past year...

Paul Calver has taken over the role of Museum Building Manager, and a friend Ian Fosker has injected fresh ideas into the look of our posters and leaflets, both play these key roles with enthusiasm.

Another Martlesham Heath resident, John Howarth, has taken on the role of Trustee Meeting Minutes Secretary (previously carried out by Alan Powell), and Peter White is helping out at the Tower, and is also proving very useful.

All this new blood, working alongside other key members of the Society, means that the last year has been very successful. The number of people coming to our monthly meetings continues to climb, helped by the high quality of our speakers.

Last year we went on a fascinating coach trip to The Bletchley Park "Codebreakers" site – this proved to be the last event financially guaranteed by Richard Barker.

Our Annual September Classic Car and Military Vehicle Event was as popular as ever – with a large crowd attending – the hard work and money made swelling our coffers.

Due to Martyn and the hard work of others – our Annual November Remembrance Service at The Barrack Square was well attended. Reverend Toby Tate took the service, and the singing was accompanied by Martlesham Brass under the leadership of Adam Cable.

The Control Tower, since re-opening on Sunday afternoons for the Summer has attracted lots of visitors – who have really appreciated the hard work done over the winter break. We are also welcoming more School, Scout and Adult Groups on pre-arranged visits.

If you have not visited the tower recently – come along and see what we have been up to.

We also welcome people to come along on Wednesday mornings on a casual basis – from 9:30 to 12 noon for people to just come along and say "hello".

Some of the cash we have generated over the year has been ploughed into improvements at the Tower – as well as on continuing erection of information boards at various points around The Heath – reinforcing that: "Yes, there once was a very important airfield here for 46 years".

Following the above – we were treated to a talk by John Howarth on his role on the design team of the final versions of the Hawker Nimrod Maritime Reconnaissance Aircraft.

The Nimrod evolved from the De Havilland Comet Airliner, to become for many years the backbone of the RAF's work over the seas around the UK and elsewhere.

Following a rarely seen DVD on the type, John explained how the aircraft evolved to become more of the "Mighty Hunter" as the name "Nimrod" implies.

All sort of modifications we fitted – during the Falklands war in flight refuelling probes were fitted in just 3 weeks as well as air to air defence missiles. Later, more effective radar was fitted to become the MR2P **Nimrod** variant – in fact a few were fitted out to become proper aerial surveillance aircraft with large radar domes fitted at the front and back. Meanwhile the antisubmarine and air-sea-rescue coordination roles were continually enhanced.

Much of this hard work came to nought in 2010 when all development work and all *Nimrods* were scrapped. This meant that for some years all the RAF had for Maritime Surveillance and submarine tracking were 2 modified *Hercules* transports and a couple of modified *Merlin* Helicopters – none of which were much cop!

However a lot of the good ideas and development ended up in the current RC-135 *Rivet Joint* electronic Surveillance aircraft currently in use by the RAF and the American Air Force.

Much has also been used in the new RAF P9 *Poseidon* Maritime Reconnaissance and anti-submarine aircraft, a modified Boeing 737 Airliner. Nine were ordered for the RAF and some are already in service.

Looking to the future our next monthly Meeting is on Friday 2nd June at 7:30 p.m. – when Paul Ross will tell "The Silver City Story" – all about an independent airline that set up just after World War 2, initially using aircraft like the "Lancastrian" (a version of the Lancaster), and the Douglas DC3 (better known to many as the Dakota) on short flights.

This at a time where flying was more of an exciting adventure – with no queues to board – but perhaps less safe than today.

Lastly – we are taking Bookings on a Sunday 6th August Coach Trip to An Air Carnival, at the fascinating Shuttleworth Collection in Bedfordshire.
