

## **Hedge Cutting and Pruning**

February is the last month to finish any hedge cutting and drastic pruning before nesting season starts. This usually runs throughout March to August each year but can be weather dependent. Some birds may nest outside this period , so it is important to always check carefully for active nests prior to cutting. Trees can still be planted but try to get ones in pots with root balls. It is more expensive, but they will be stronger in any drought periods later in the year.

# From Your Conservative District The Local Community Partnership met **Councillor: Chris Blundell**

## The Walking and Cycling Routes.

Martlesham was initially concerned with the 'connectivity' between Brightwell Lakes and Martlesham Heath which for various reasons is desirable. However, with the determination by HMG to reduce the number of domestic vehicles on the road, thus reducing carbon dioxide pollution, it was recognised that walking and cycling routes around the country are woefully inadequate. Hence the pressure on county councils to produce suitable and useful walking and cycling routes.

SCC in their wisdom chose, as one of their options a possible route, that would straddle the A12 at an angle, pass through the wooded gap between the southern end of Coopers Road and the north pert of Lancaster Drive and from there to continue across Eagle Way and forge a new path through the middle of Birch Woods at the southern end of the much-cherished recreational green.

As you may understand many of our residents are strongly opposed to the route passing through Birch woods. The possible abuse of cyclists taking 'short cuts' either across the 'Green' or through the SSSI that borders Dobbs Lane has really caused significant upset throughout the whole community of Martlesham Heath and beyond. I too opposed this route. The cost of creating this particularly unwelcomed path may just make the route designers think again. Let us hope so!

This last year the partnership considered the very important topic of Safety on the Roads. Normally, this is the responsibility of the County Council. So, the question arose as to what if anything the CP could and should do to improve the safety of all road users.

The narrow roads that link most of our rural and not so rural roads are a source of great concern because of vehicles travelling at what are deemed to be excessive speeds. Thus, there is a big demand for devices that can measure the speed at which a vehicle is travelling. Two such devices are the Speed Indication Device (SIDs) and Automatic Number Plate Recognition Device (ANPRs). Unfortunately, the ANPR device is not available for use by local voluntary groups.

The local CP considered and granted requests for SIDs in Rushmere St Andrew, Carlford and the Fynn Valley area and the Witnesham and Swilland area.

Most significantly, the CP agreed to fund the supply of Hi-Vis jackets to at least six primary schools in our area that included both Martlesham and Grundisburgh. I am very pleased to report that the supply of Hi-Vis jackets was reported in an article in the EADT on Tuesday 11th January and also in Mark Murphy's broadcast the same day. Funding was also allocated by the Kesgrave, Rushmere St Andrew, Martlesham, Carlford & Fynn Valley Community Partnership, of which I am the Chairman, toward an improvement at what the EADT referred to as a 'Lethal' junction known as the Gibraltar Crossroads, which connects the B1078 and

High Road between Ashbocking and Suffolk Rural College (formerly, Otley College).

To have significant articles in the EADT on the decisions of the CP meeting on two separate days was, I thought, quite an achievement.

Planning Matters. There are no new large scale development plans to consider in Martlesham. However, the proposed new Storage and Distribution Centre along the A1156 in Foxhall is likely to have a significant effect on the Local roads including the A14 and the A12.

- d. Suffolk Highways.
- e. Suffolk County Councillors for the area.

The first meeting is scheduled for the 25th February 2022.

The Greenways team have been undertaking more heathland maintenance on the Martlesham Heath SSSI during January. The main aim this year has been to benefit the special wildlife that depends on lowland heath for its continued survival and also to improve access and movement around the site for members of the public and for emergency vehicles that may need to get onto the site in the event of a fire for example. Areas of gorse and other scrub have been cleared, which will hopefully allow more heather and acid grassland to flourish. A typical species that could benefit would be the Silver Studded Blue butterfly that relies on heather and other heathland flora and insects for its survival. Penetration of more light to the ground will also help the ground to warm up and be of benefit to a wide range of insects such as ants and butterflies, and reptiles that need warmth in order to become active.

We have had some interesting winter wildlife around during January including flocks of Redwing and Linnets, Foxes basking in the sunshine of a cold winter's day and strikingly coloured Bullfinches. The month of February can be one of increased activity for wildlife. Some birds have already started to sing. This chorus of song is likely increase throughout February and into the later spring months as migrating birds arrive from more southerly regions of our planet. If there are warmer days in late February reptiles such as adders can begin to emerge and bask in the stronger rays of sunshine.

If the weather is cold please remember that your garden could make a real difference to the survival of some wildlife. Please continue to provide water and food for birds, and don't be too keen to tidy up; you could have a hedgehog under that pile of branches and leaves.

Many thanks to all the volunteers who came out on our main work party in January. We were able to deploy our new winch and successfully remove scrub from an area of heather. Our next regular work party will take place on Sunday 6th February at 10am, meet on the Martlesham Heath SSSI at the bonfire site.

# MARTLESHAM IN BLOOM Spring is on its way!

Some early flowering bulbs such as crocus, snowdrops and winter aconites will be flowering in gardens, and providing nectar to any early bees venturing out.

If you are cutting back hedges and shrubs, be careful and keep a watchful eye out as some birds may have already started to build nests, we have seen blackbirds and woodpigeons nesting early in recent years.

It may surprise you to know that in the 5th Birds of Conservation Concern report (covers birds in the UK, Channel Isles and Isle of Man), published last year, woodpigeons had moved from green to amber-listed (meaning it is a species of concern)!

The UK population of woodpigeons is of international importance as the UK contains over 20% of Europe's wood pigeons (BTO Garden BirdWatch Enews 5th December 2021).

The more plants and variety of plants you can grow in your garden the better it will be at providing habitat for wildlife, including birds and insects. There is still time to plant bare rooted trees and shrubs; keep their roots covered and damp from when you have purchased them right through to planting and do not plant if the ground is frozen. Containerised trees and shrubs can be planted all year round although the best time is October to March, if planted during the late spring and summer they will need extra attention to watering to help them establish.

When planting permanent plants in your garden, whether evergreen or deciduous, applying some mycorrhizal fungi to the roots (which can be purchased from some garden centres, nurseries and retailers) when planting will help them establish. It gives them a better chance of quickly connecting into the the web of natural mycorrhizal fungi which live throughout most of our soils. These fungi connect with plant roots in a symbiotic relationship which helps facilitate the uptake of water and nutrients from the soil.

# Climate Change Jottings - Article 3: Changing the way we get around.

This is the next article in a series that look at how we can all reduce our carbon footprint based on a series of articles by John Hall former CEO of Essex Wildlife Trust who was awarded an MBE for services to the environment.

News from around the world gives a stark warning that we have to act quickly to curb our carbon emissions: horrendous fires in Australia, Greece and California, searing heat in Canada and Turkey, ice melt in Greenland and Antarctica, serious floods in Europe. World leaders met at COP 26 in Glasgow in November 2021 to cooperate to keep global temperature rise down to +1.5 degrees C. Progress was made but currently nowhere near enough to achieve + 1.5 degrees. We must all eventually aim to reduce our carbon footprint from the around 10 tonnes of carbon emissions per year for an average citizen, to 1 tonne to avoid the worst impacts of climate change. As an interim goal it is estimated that we all need to reduce our carbon emissions by 50% by 2030 to

ensure the world does not heat up beyond the +1.5 degree increase target over pre-industrial levels

In the first two articles we looked at our food choices and our energy choices, which, if we were really determined, could save 1.5 tonnes and 2 tonnes respectively. This month we look at how we get around. Most of us are still wedded to our petrol or diesel car. The media is full of information about electric vehicles (FV's) and the UK Government has legislated to stop the production of petrol and diesel cars by 2030. All car manufacturers are bringing out EV's, hybrid and plug-in hybrid models and electric car sales are increasing rapidly. So how much of your carbon footprint would it save? If you change to a fully electric vehicle this would save about 2 tonnes of carbon; a plug-in hybrid would save about 0.6 tonnes; a full hybrid would save very little carbon (disappointing as I have a 9 year old Yaris Hybrid). As people wrestle with the decision, they rightly raise concerns about EV's.

"I'm concerned about the range." Early EV's like Nissan Leaf with a 30kWh battery (1 kiloWatt hour is 1 unit of electricity) would do about 130 miles; more recent models will do up to 300 miles and a Tesla up to 400 miles.

"How quickly will it charge up?" This depends on how you charge it. From a 13amp plug charging at 2.5kW it would take about 12 hours or overnight; but if you are on a journey then fast charging areas can fill your battery in under 45 minutes.

"What if all the chargers are occupied?" An App will tell you where the nearest chargers are and also which are occupied.

What you do need to do is change the way you think about using the car. You must think ahead – you can't just fill the tank when the warning light comes on. If you get over your early fears, there is the capital cost: an EV is more expensive than the petrol equivalent but much cheaper to run. So, are you prepared to help ensure a liveable planet or not? If so, the extra cost will reduce your carbon emissions by about 2 tonnes.

EV's are not the silver bullet. If we all moved to EV's overnight this would produce an enormous reduction in carbon emissions, but a massive strain on the National Grid and we would still demand the increase in roads that can plague the countryside, towns and villages. We also need to shift our culture by doing fewer miles by car. 60% of journeys by car are less than 2 miles and these could be undertaken on foot or by bike. Many families have bikes in the shed but don't use them. It takes determination to get on your bike or walk to the shops or school with the kids even though the rewards for better health are well documented. What we need to do is to encourage good safe paths and cycle ways - so press your local Councils.



Improved public transport is also a crucial option to enable all abilities to get around reliably without always resorting to the car. Use the bus for short journeys and the train for longer ones. Even if you don't switch to an EV, using cycling, walking and public transport could save you about 1 tonne.

Air travel is the biggest concern for carbon emissions. One long distance return flight to Tokyo or Perth would count for 6.5 tonnes of carbon: even a short haul return flight in Europe would count for 1 tonne per person. Many residents might be content with 1 flight per year but 15% of us are taking several flights a year. Being blunt, that is totally unsustainable in the current crisis. And before you write me off as a killjoy, stopping holidays or family visits just reflect on what future you want for you and your family. The latest IPCC Report that summarises all the scientific evidence gathered over decades is out. No ifs, no buts: "Climate Change is here, it is here to stay and it is caused by us (and it is getting worse)". We each must change course or serious fires, violent storms, flash floods, sea level rise and unbearable hot spells will increasingly be the norm - not the exception (with adverse knock on effects to food and water security, world economies, mass migration of people and collapse of ecosystems). Recent weather in North America has broken all records. We have just had the mildest January day on record (not a cause for celebration but deeply worrying).

In summary, if we significantly change the way we get around we can each reduce our carbon footprint by at least 2 tonnes.

If you would like to start on your journey to 50% reduction by 2030 you could have a look at https://footprint.wwf.org.uk/#/ to get an idea of your current carbon footprint.



#### **MARTLESHAM HEATH AVIATION SOCIETY**

Friday 7th January 2022 and we held our first public meeting of the year. Turn-out was most encouraging considering the restrictions we are living under. We had a most entertaining evening by Mr Eric Ratcliffe. Eric is chairman of the Tibenham Gliding Club and is an authority on the history of the WW2 airfield. He has recently published a book entitled, "The Kassel Raid". The Kassel Raid, took place on the 27th September 1944 and resulted in the largest loss by USAAF Group on any mission in WWII. 283 Consolidated B-24 Liberator bombers from the USAAF's 2nd Combat Bombardment Wing were accompanied by 198 P-51 Mustangs. As the result of a navigation error, the lead ship of the 445th Bombardment Group from Tibenham turned almost due east instead of east-southeast. As a result 35 bombers lost their fighter escort and 25 bombers were shot down. Only four bombers made it home to Tibenham. 118 Americans were killed, of whom 11 were murdered by civilians after parachuting to safety. 121 Americans ended up in German POW camps and survived.

A vote of thanks was given by our president, Mr Richard Barker.

Our next meeting will be on Friday, 4th February, when our member, Andrew Locke, who is a retired Master Sergeant in the USAF. He was at RAF Bentwaters and now lives at Brandeston. His talk will be of his experiences with Phantoms, A10 Warthog tank busters and other aircraft. Promises to be a most interesting evening.

#### PPG NEWS FOR PATIENTS OF MARTLESHAM HEATH SURGERY

This is to let you know about a new way of contacting your doctor or other clinician being introduced at Martlesham Heath surgery from 18th January 2022. It's called "askmyGP". The Birches practice in Kesgrave adopted this approach last year and it has proved to be popular with patients and staff, so the same system is to be introduced for our patients. Hopefully, it will avoid all those repeated attempts to get through when phone lines open each morning, often followed by waiting in a queue for a receptionist to become free.

The new system allows patients or their carers to send in a request for health advice via an online link, at any time of day or night, from 6am Monday to 6.30pm Friday. You might want to request advice about a medical condition (non-emergency), medication or your test results, for example. You can expect a prompt response during surgery working hours (8am – 6.30pm Mon-Fri).

It's important to say that patients who are unable to use this technology can continue to phone in as before. Receptionists will ask patients for the same information as via the online system, so everyone will be treated the same, whichever method they use to make their enquiries. Since the number of people phoning will be fewer than before, it should be much easier for callers to get through.

These are the steps for using askmyGP:

- Using your computer, smart phone or tablet, click the askmyGP link for our practice

   it will be on the website at www.mhdoctors.co.uk. The first time you use it, you will need to register. After that, you'll log in using a password.
- Once connected, you will see some straightforward questions where you can type in what you need help with e.g. your symptoms, how long you've had them, who you saw before for this condition, what outcome you are seeking and any other relevant information. You can even add photos if you want.
- 3. The information you send is via a secure link and confidential only seen by staff at our own practice. They will respond by the means you requested, e.g. secure message or phone, providing clinical advice/information or offering you a phone or in-person appointment, usually the same day, when required.

Advantages are that it saves you time, no waiting to speak to a busy receptionist and no unnecessary trips to the surgery if you don't need to see someone in person. You can send your enquiry at a time which suits you. It saves the doctor time too, because they can read the information you've sent and check your medical history in advance of your appointment. They can tailor the length of consultation to suit your needs – some patients may need a quick call back, others may need a longer than normal appointment slot. The new system is more flexible and the PPG hopes we will all find it to be beneficial.

If you've been reading the papers or keeping an eye on social media, you've probably noticed that one of the big ideas for 2022 is your breath! The way you breathe and the effect it has on your body and your overall sense of wellbeing is a hot topic.

Fortunately, most of us can breathe pretty successfully and probably don't pay much attention to our breathing, unless we exercise and find our breath rate increasing. However, paying attention to your breath in different situations can tell you a lot about yourself. And the really interesting thing is that by learning how to control and regulate your breathing, you can find a greater level of confidence in yourself, which can be a great source of strength in all sorts of situations.

Controlling your breathing can help when you are giving a presentation, making and communicating a decision you have made,

managing a difficult relationship or discussing an important matter with your boss. It can also be the key to improving your performance in running, cycling, swimming or it can help you prepare for that cold water swim you've been longing to try!

Hatha yoga, which is one of the most popular forms of yoga, includes breathing practices, known as pranayama and different techniques are used for cleansing, energising, balancing your energy and for calming. The calming effects of breathing are well known – if we feel anxious, we are used to being encouraged to "just breathe!" And there is plenty of advice available for calming the breath – in yoga we breathe out for a count of 4 and in for 2, through the nose, because lengthening the out breath helps to release tension and gives room for the incoming breath.

If you'd like to learn more about your breath and discover how to regulate it, then do get in touch with me. As well as weekly group

sessions I offer one to one sessions online or face to face at the Woodbridge Complementary Health Centre in Sandy Lane, Martlesham and at the Natural Health Centre in the Thoroughfare in Woodbridge. These one to one sessions are designed specially for you so that we can focus on what you need from your yoga to support your physical and mental wellbeing.

I love sharing yoga with complete beginners, those returning to yoga and those who are experienced and want to learn advanced yoga postures, breathing practices, relaxation and meditation or mindfulness. The Mothers' Union members are not all mothers or even all women. Married or single, male or female, young or old there is a place for anyone in the Mothers' Union. Liverpool diocese even has a group called Mini Mums, who are all school children who wanted to have their own group within Mothers' Union.

The main aim of Mothers' Union is to support marriage and family life, especially through times of adversity. In Suffolk Mothers' Union branches run parenting programmes; these are very popular and offer parents of teenagers, as well as of young children, the opportunity to explore and reflect on issues such as active listening, so that parents can develop and maintain positive relationships with their children

Mothers' Union members make drain bags for the oncology unit, memory bags for the neonatal units, hats for seafarers, fiddle muffs for people with dementia. You will find us collecting toiletry items for the Ipswich night shelter and Women's refuge or for emergency wash bags for the local hospitals. In the first weeks of lockdown one branch made 61 laundry bags for the staff of a local care home.

Mothers' Union members hold fund raising events to support the Away from It All project which provides a much-needed break for families who are going through stressful times.

All our outreach work is supported through prayer. In July each year we join a wave of prayer made up of Mothers' Union members across the world. At the beginning of the first lockdown we published a Book of Comfort which included prayer, poems and reflections specifically for the Covid19 pandemic.


