

The new Financial Year 2022/23. At this time of year, I begin to receive requests for financial assistance with local Projects. Provided there is a clear community benefit I am happy to support them. One of the greatest joys that I currently have is that being instrumental in arranging for funds to be supplied from East Suffolk Council and occasionally from myself, then seeing the new equipment/facilities in use. It is very gratifying.

Identifying the Projects. Often a group or organisation will approach me for funds. At other times I approach a group because as I move around both my ward and the district it becomes obvious to me that there is a real need for me to help. A good, recent example, was the Community Hall in old Felixstowe Road. Their committee had embarked upon a complete refurbishment of the hall and an improvement in facilities. In particular they wished to install a projector and screen that would be of great benefit particularly to the Aviation Society and other users. They did not ask for the funds but as the cost of purchase and installation was going to be a few thousand pounds I decided to supply them with the bulk of the required funds.

The Felixstowe Triathlon. Entries are now open for the second Felixstowe Triathlon. This will take place this August Bank Holiday weekend. Individuals and teams can sign up to participate in the award-winning event, organised by Suffolk Tri with support from the East Suffolk and Felixstowe Town Councils. People can sign up for the Sprint, Super sprint or Standard Distance at: www.felixstowetriathlon.uk/.

Holiday Activity and Food. The East Suffolk Council is accepting funding of £522,562 from Suffolk County Council to administer the Holiday Activity and Food Program for East Suffolk for 2022/23 and the following two years.

The Holiday Activity and Food (HAF) programme is an important element of support available to children and young people from low-income families and will provide them with an opportunity to access enriching activities to improve their mental and physical health and well being as well as at least one nutritionally balanced meal each day for four days a week during key holiday periods.

This provision is likely to be even more in demand in 2022 given the impact of cost-of-living increases combined with the end of the additional £20 per week Universal Credit payment and continuing low wages in East Suffolk on family budgets.

Tackling Long term Empty Homes.

ESC has declared Deprivation and Disadvantage as a 10th 'characteristic' for the purpose of assuring Equality in our district. There are opportunities in working to bring back into use Long Term Empty Homes (LTEH), to develop housing units offered at affordable rents, thereby supporting those on low incomes.

Funding to support the development of a LTEH programme is available within reserves created from the New Homes Bonus that East Suffolk Council has been able to claim from Central Government in recent years. The New Homes Bonus was introduced in 2011 to provide an incentive for local authorities to encourage housing growth in their areas.

Martlesham Conservation Group

The weather through the late winter and early spring has again been very variable. Most months have been relatively mild; March was cold and unseasonably warm at times with early April being relatively cold. Some wildlife can struggle to adapt. Chiff Chaffs appeared locally in mid March, shortly followed by Blackcaps and on the warmer days a few butterflies appeared, including Brimstone, Small Tortoiseshell, Comma, and Peacock. However the sudden changes to cold weather may have been detrimental to their numbers. Buzzards are seen regularly drifting across the sky with occasional appearances of Red Kites and Peregrine falcons (these have been nesting on the BT site for several years). Adders have been seen out on the heath so dog owners are advised to take care and keep their dogs on a lead as this action could avoid unnecessary distress or injury. Throughout May more butterfly species should appear including the Green Hairstreak butterfly a heathland species that relies on gorse as its food plant, as well as the wandering Orange Tip, and Speckled Wood. As for other birds, hopefully our heath and woodland will resound again to that prolific songbird the Nightingale especially at night, whilst other species including migrants such as Garden Warbler, Whitethroat and Lesser Whitethroat add to the soundscape during the day.

For our work party in May we will be undertaking a walk around the wood to the south of the green on Martlesham Heath on Sunday15th May starting at 10am. We will try to identify the bird species present by sight and song. Please meet outside the Douglas Bader PH and bring a pair of binoculars if you have them. Please contact me if you are interested in taking part in any of our work parties or wildlife surveys. Please let us know if you have any interesting wildlife observations.

Martlesham in Bloom

May is the ideal time for planning what summer bedding you would like to have in your garden.

As many are tender, to be sure of them surviving wait until the last frosts and cold weather has passed before planting them out - if in doubt, as a rule of thumb the end of May is generally the time to start planting them out in borders, baskets and containers. There will be many for sale at nurseries and garden centres; if you have been growing them yourself from seed they will need hardening off. This means putting them outside during the day, then back under cover at night for a week or two to get them used to being out of doors before planting them out permanently.

Don't forget tomatoes and beans which can be grown outside late May onwards; they benefit pollinators as well as us! If you have been growing sweet peas they can be planted out earlier than other summer bedding plants as they are hardier. It is not too late to sow Sunflowers - another plant pollinators love, with their colourful, open flowers.

To help pollinators and other invertebrates, if you have the space, why not leave part of your lawn to grow long during the summer? Wildflowers may come up as well as grasses, which will look lovely and provide both habitat and food for pollinators and many other invertebrates. Long grass and wildflowers provide the ideal location for many soil invertebrates and insect larvae, including moth and butterfly caterpillars, so by leaving it long until mid to late September you will be helping them through their whole life-cycle.





Martlesham Climate Action

Martlesham Repair and Climate Advice Hub, Refill shop + TerraCycle,

Saturday 14th May, 10 - 12 St Michael's Church.

A reminder that our Repair Hub runs on the second Saturday of the month in St Michael's church 10-12am. Next one is 14th May. Bring along things for free help and advice on repair (donations welcome to cover the cost of the hall). Don't bin it, repair and reuse it! This includes clothes, appliances, toys, furniture etc.

The Climate Advice Hub will also be there with free advice leaflets on how to 'do your bit' to reduce your carbon footprint and reduce your energy bills. We have an Infrared camera that can help spot cold spots or poor window/door seals causing heat loss. We can also offer impartial advice (i.e. from the experience of residents) on what to ask companies if you are thinking of getting quotes for solar + battery systems (or go to our website).

The Woodbridge Eco Refill shop will have a table at the Hub where you can stop buying new plastic bottles (and therefore help reduce carbon emissions) by bringing old bottles to refill with washing up liquid, non-bio laundry, fabric conditioner, body wash, shampoo/conditioner, cleaning spray and hand soap. The shop plans to be there for your refills at every Repair and Climate Advice Hub.

NEW for May: the shop will also have a TerraCycle bin for recycling hard to recycle items as part of the national TerraCycling scheme. Items that can be placed in the bin are: empty medicine packets, toothpaste tubes and caps, plastic toothbrush outer packaging, electric toothbrush (heads only), plastic toothbrushes, floss containers and packaging.

Garden Rewilding Competition

A reminder that as part of our bid to increase even further the number of wilder/natural spaces in the parish we are launching a 'Garden rewilding' competition. Further details on our stand at the Village fete on 16th July. If you would like to take part then think of an area of your garden you can 'donate' to nature (e.g. dig a small pond,

plant a wildflower area/meadow grass, build a log pile, add a hedgehog highway gap in your fence etc: consult our calendar for ideas!), take some 'before' pictures and then implement some rewilding over the course of the year. We'll ask for some 'after' photos next year and will have prizes for the best entries and window stickers for all that take part!

Your waste, your planet: a rethink.

The total amount of waste collected in a typical council district is 300kg per person per year – but this amount has not reduced significantly over the last 10 years. This represents an enormous amount of household rubbish – a vast number of lorry journeys transporting our rubbish, a tremendous effort to sort it and process it, and large areas of smelly landfill sites which produce a lot of greenhouse gases. The biggest practical step we can all take to help the planet is to reduce the amount of rubbish that each of us produces. Recycling is important but Reducing rubbish is even more important.

Reducing starts by Refusing – refusing to buy what we do not need; refusing to buy goods wrapped in excessive plastic or cardboard. It means buying from local shops, taking your own bags and containers which can be reused and refilled. It means doing more to repair things rather than chuck. It means asking ourselves "Do I really need to buy this? Will it really be useful or am I likely to chuck it?"

I recently spoke to Isabel Losada at the Woodbridge Climate Action event. She is an author whose has written several acclaimed books including one called the 'Joyful Environmentalist'. The first chapter highlights the change in attitude we all need to make. If you buy chicken from Duncans, why not take a cleaned aluminium tray? We take back paper bags to the veg stall for reuse. Small things, but the key is the change in mindset.

As well as Refusing, try Repairing (don't forget our Repair Hub is on monthly on the second Saturday of the month) and Reusing. Another example of this is reuse of plastic bottles by refilling with common household liquids. Bring empty bottles to the Repair and Climate Advice hub to get refills from the local Eco Refill shop. Poppy's Pantry, EMMAUS and Cupboard Love also do refills. It is a bit more inconvenient for each of us, but it's worth it because it will reduce your carbon footprint by about 0.3 tonnes of carbon per year.



If you recall, previous articles have explained that everyone's aim should be to try and reduce their own carbon emissions from an average of around 8-10 tonnes of carbon emissions per year to 1 tonne to avoid the worst consequences of global warming. So far in these articles we have shown how it is possible to reduce our carbon footprints by 1.5 tonnes through food choices, by 2 tonnes through energy choices, by 2 tonnes through better travel choices, by 0.3 tonnes through our wardrobe and now 0.3 tonnes through waste: a total of 6.1 tonnes. We are getting there!

Perhaps 0.3 tonnes doesn't seem a big reduction in carbon emissions but it carries with it major benefits for the wider environment. If we all recycle better using the Council kerbside collection and recycling centres, less of Suffolk is taken up by smelly landfill sites. Aluminium and steel are recovered from cans; plastic bottles are reformed into plastic products so less microplastics into our seas and rivers; paper and card are recovered to form new cardboard; glass bottles make new glass; garden waste makes compost; wood is chipped to make chip board etc. Make sure you only put the right things in the blue and brown bins: go to https:// www.suffolkrecycling.org.uk to check if you are in doubt. A significant percentage of loads are contaminated and go to landfill as people put the wrong items in the bins.

So, Rethink your waste and how to Reduce it. Firstly think about how you can Refuse, Repair and Reuse and then Recycle as much as you can.



MARTLESHAM HEATH AVIATION SOCIETY

On Friday 1st April, the Martlesham Heath Aviation was treated to a truly sparkling and entertaining talk when Rick Hobson outlined his 20 years of operational flying, most of it in the RAF military workhorse, the Lockheed Hercules four engine transport.

Unbelievably the Hercules first flew around 1954. and has and is still, serving in Air Forces around the world, with (at 2015) over 2,500 built in 40 variants. However it is due to leave RAF service in 2023 – being effectively worn out!

Rick went into the RAF initially to fly combat aircraft, training on aircraft such as The Hawk trainer – however he realised that he did not have the "Killer instinct" for such a role – so transferred over to flying RAF Transports, mainly the Hercules. He reckoned that he had a far more interesting flying career as a result.

He has flown on all 7 continents – from Ice Caps to Deserts and in War Zones, and landed -sometimes under fire, often on inhospitable and really difficult runways.

He flew humanitarian missions – and missions in war torn countries – where he was in danger from ground fire – and he told the stories of all types of flying, and the best way to survive them. He also flew the Hercules in flying tanker missions supporting aircraft going to the Falklands – and did spend some long postings in the Falklands with the Hercules.

The talk was pitched just right... we all learned a lot about the Hercules – and enjoyed hearing his RAF experiences, both on and off duty... with lots of humorous content. For instance when he was flying in and out of Afghanistan – the crews slept in tents – much to the amusement of the Americans – who christened the RAF team The Flint-Stones, whereupon the RAF Changed their aircraft call sign "Bedrock 1 or 2 etc etc"

His career moved on and he was at the forefront of the introduction of the updated/uprated Lockheed Hercules C130-J, with more efficient and powerful turbo-prop engines and the so called "Glass Cockpit" which reduced the need for a Navigator and Flight Engineer. Also fitted was Ground Mapping Radar and a computerised suite to enable aid to be dropped with far more accuracy..

After About 20 years he went to fly a desk in Whitehall. His transport flying experience was essential as he was in the team introducing new transport aircraft.... including the Airbus A400M.

His talk, which was put on at short notice to replace our original speaker, really hit the mark, and was really appreciated by the audience. Extra thanks are due to Rick for coming in so quickly. Our busy Chairman Martyn Cook, summed up Rick's talk with a well deserved vote of thanks.

Our next meeting on Friday, 6th May and will be the occasion of our annual executers report, followed by fascinating and rarely seen videos. All meetings start at 7.30pm, with a tea/coffee break. Non-members are welcome and there is no charge for this meeting.


