Brightwell Lakes development

Commencement of work on the new development has rolled over to the New Year. We understand that discussions are ongoing with regard to the management of the A12 roundabouts with traffic lights. It is anticipated that first residents will move in early 2020. The Parish Council is now represented on the "Brightwell Lakes Community Forum" the aims of which include "To provide a positive contribution to the design and development of the site with the interests of both new residents and existing surrounding residents in mind".



CHRIS BLUNDELL'S DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT FOR DECEMBER 2018

First a Correction. In my news letter with the November edition of the MM, I stated that the recommendations for the proposed new Martlesham and Purdis Farm ward for East Suffolk would include Waldringfield. The Local Government Boundary Commission for England accepted an argument from Waldringfield that the nature of their parish was more suited to being retained as a more rural area and therefore allocated Waldringfield to the Orwell Villages Ward and not Martlesham. The new Martlesham & Purdis Farm Ward will now consist of: Martlesham, Martlesham Heath, Brightwell, Foxhall and Purdis Farm.

Some Good News. Suffolk Coastal District Council, on behalf of all the Suffolk Authorities has been awarded a grant of £87,500 to deliver a pilot scheme supporting patients with housing needs when they are discharged from hospital, as well as reducing the chance of them being admitted to hospital.

Based on the successful Warm Homes Healthy People model, the funding will pay for a housing co-ordinator to work in Ipswich Hospital and the local community to resolve complex housing-related patient issues.

The project includes the lease of two "halfway home hubs" to provide temporary accommodation for patients who are medically fit for discharge but cannot return home until a housing issue is resolved. The project will give practical assistance to resolve problems that prevent patients from returning to or remaining in their homes.

MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP

The autumn and winter period is a time of increased practical conservation work as all the nesting activities of birds has been completed and it is possible to remove vegetation whilst minimising the impact on wildlife. The Conservation group intends to be active on a number of tasks. Over the same period contractors are likely to be working on the heath SSSI for periods of a few days at a time. Several of these work tasks may involve the use of mechanised equipment. Please watch out for them and us and take care for your own safety as you walk around the heath.

Please join us for our next work party on Sunday 9th December at 10 am on the heath SSSI (western corridor) by the bank that runs east-west across the site. We will be working to cut back the scrubby vegetation for the benefit of the wildlife and public. All tools and instructions will be provided on the day.

You may attract more wildlife into your garden over autumn and winter by being a little less tidy. For example you could help a hedgehog to endure the winter months by leaving some vegetation to provide shelter. Please let autumn leaves rot where they fall or rake them in to piles. Please leave areas uncut over winter and always check for hedgehogs whenever you cut long grass or bramble. Also a number of bird species will join us from colder climates to the north over the winter period; the heath had several visitors over the winter period last year such as Stonechat, Dartford Warblers, Redwings and Fieldfares; even familiar species such as Blackbirds could have migrated from a considerable distance. Please spare a thought for our wild birds and remember to put out food and water in your gardens to help them through the cold spells.





MARTLESHAM HEATH AVIATION SOCIETY

Our meeting on Friday 2nd November was a joint illustrated talk. In the first half our chairman, Martyn Cook, explained the aviation history of Martlesham. How, during the Great War until the outbreak of the second world war RAF Martlesham was second in importance only to the Royal Aircraft Establishment at Farnborough. This was because it was home to the Aeroplane and Armament Experimental Establishment, where all aircraft, both military and civil were evaluated.

Martyn went on to describe the part RAF Martlesham played during WW2. It was one of 11 Group. the ring of airfields surrounding London that played such an enormous role in the Battle of Britain. The arrival of the Americans in late 1943 and the various post war roles in Blind Landing development and other lanes of aviation development were all explained by Martyn.

In the second half, our Publicity secretary, Howard King talked about the development of gliders and the last years of Martlesham airfield, when it was used by the ATC for gliding and before it closed, in 1963..

A popular evening of much interest to many Martlesham residents who attended. A vote of thanks was given by our president, Richard Barker.
