

MARTLESHAM IN BLOOM

Now we are in to summer it is the ideal time for you to plant out any tender plants such as crops like tomatoes and beans, and summer flowering annuals; they could be plants you have raised from seed yourself or those bought at garden centres or nurseries. They can be planted out in beds, borders, baskets, and window boxes whatever is appropriate to your location and the size the plant is going to grow!

When deciding what summer flowers to plant in your garden or outside space why not encourage pollinators to visit by growing flowers which they can access for pollen and nectar; this will help them as well as providing added interest in your garden. You can do this by aiming to have at least some single flowered plants i.e. those you can see the centre of, which are not double with lots of extra petals. If you can include a mixture of different flower

shapes that is even better because different pollinators will visit different

flowers, for example moths, butterflies and some bumblebees have long tongues so will visit flowers such as Cerinthe (Honeywort), Fuchsia and Nasturtiums. Other pollinators, such as hoverflies, wasps, beetles, solitary bees and many bumble bees have short tongues; flowers such as Comfrey, Californian poppy, Cosmos, and single Dahlias have pollen and nectar that is accessible to them.

Having a mixture of flowers within your garden will provide a beautiful display for you and the pollinators to enjoy. Happy gardening!

'I have found being a councillor challenging, exciting and fulfilling. I work with a very diverse and interesting group of people and no two days (or meetings) have ever been the same.


I have been involved with a variety of projects including:

Scouts Freddie, Harry, James and Oliver completed the award as members of 1st Martlesham. Scouts and have now moved on to Spitfire Explorer Scout Unit, also based at Martlesham. The Chief Scout's Gold Award is the highest award in Scouts section and the four Scouts had to complete nine challenges to achieve the top award. BRIGHT STARS

Martlesham Conservation Group

We have a number of Nightingales out on the heath SSSI and in our woodland this year. They like the thicker more bushy vegetation, with the males giving vent to their complex and varied song from deep in a bush, which makes them difficult to see.

They can get very loud especially if adjacent males are competing against each other to defend their territory. They will often sing through the night and large parts of the day and can usually be heard singing through into early June but then go quiet. However it seems that this year their song has been a lot more difficult to hear, maybe the extensive period of dry weather has had an impact on them.

Listen out carefully before the first week of June as this could be your last chance to experience this wonderful birdsong until next year.

Other migrant birds that have been making themselves heard include the Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Garden Warbler and Blackcap. The Blackcap also has a rather beautiful song, but not as rich and varied as the Nightingale, and with less harsh notes. Last year we also had a cuckoo singing on the heath

but as of writing no cuckoo has been heard.

During walks around the heath we have come across two dead grass snakes. Please can we urge all you to take great care to look after our native reptiles, and if you are a dog owner please walk your dog on a lead. Our native reptiles are protected by law in Great Britain. It is illegal to deliberately kill, injure or sell/trade in them. They are all declining and need all the help they can get.

The spring butterflies such as the bright yellow Brimstone, Orange Tip, multi-coloured Peacock, Holly Blue, Small Copper, Green Hairstreak and Brown Argus have appeared on warm days. By June, these earlier spring species will disappear, then late spring and summer species appear. Look out for Common Blue, Meadow Brown, Gatekeeper, three types of Skipper, Silver Studded Blue, and Purple Hairstreak. June can be an especially good month for butterflies and in some very good years it may be possible to see about 18 species on a single day out on the heath if conditions are favourable.

June should also see the emergence of the adult Silver Studded Blue butterflies on the

heath; the caterpillars of these small blue butterflies use heather(and some other heathland plants) as their food plant but also involve small black ants in their life-cycle. Both need to be present for a successful colony. Later in June (probably in the fourth week) we will attempt to count these butterflies on the heath SSSI and Common, please get in touch if you would like to be involved. Numbers were low last year and so we may need to search hard.

Our practical work party for June will be on Sunday 1st June at 10am. Please meet on the Martlesham Heath SSSI by the bank that runs east-west just along from the signboard between "Heathfield" and "The Oaks" We will begin work on controlling invasive bracken that threatens to choke out the heather and acid grassland that is more beneficial for a wide range of wildlife.

Please contact me if you are interested in taking part in any of our work parties or wildlife surveys and please let us know if you have any interesting wildlife observations.

Many grateful thanks to those who supported our Plant Sale at Foxburrow Farm Nature Reserve, Melton on Sunday 4th May. It was a good afternoon, although a bit colder than some years, and we raised £1407 towards our conservation work for wildlife in Suffolk.

It was also great to be entertained by a pair of Grey Wagtails that flitted on the roof of the barn looking for insects for a second year.

On Saturday 14th June at 8am we have a Moth Trap event at Fen Meadow in Woodbridge. Just turn up at 8am to help empty the trap whilst we have an expert on hand to help us identify the moths.

Smart Meters; they don't spy on you!!

Smart energy meters: The Government wants us all to have smart meters, but misinformation about how they work and what value they bring is causing some resistance to adoption.

A smart electricity meter records energy supplied, and energy exported to the grid. It can record energy measurements as frequently as 30-minute intervals. It communicates the information automatically to a data collection company (DCC) to be passed to your energy supplier. The smart meter is installed in replacement for the old basic meter. If you also have a smart gas meter, it can also record gas consumption at 30-minute intervals, reporting via the electricity smart meter.

You may additionally be provided with an inhome display (IHD) which can display power and energy consumption, as well as an indication of cost*. Energy suppliers provide the facility to view your energy consumption (and export) and costs using a website and using an app on your smartphone, if you have one. Some suppliers provide the facility to download reported data for your own analysis, if you are so inclined.

What benefits does this set-up provide? Automatic reporting of energy use enables monthly accurate billing with no need to submit readings or have the uncertainty of estimated readings. The continuous flow of data enables you to view consumption and cost using the website or app, usually with a lag of a day or two. The 30-minute measurement intervals allow energy suppliers to offer a variety of multi-rate time-of-day tariffs that were not possible with the old meters. The single-rate tariff and Economy 7 tariff with a "cheap" overnight rate are still available, but there are also tariffs designed for electric vehicle owners, heat pump system owners and even dynamic

tariffs that follow market rates during each 30minute period of the day. If you have a solar PV system, possibly with a home battery, you need a smart meter to take

advantage of a "Smart Energy

Generation" (SEG) export tariff where your energy company credits you for surplus solar energy that you export to the grid. Note: older PV systems attracted credit for "assumed" export under a Feed-in Tariff (FIT) scheme.

m Climate

*I mentioned that the IHD provides an "indication" of energy costs. In practice, especially with smart time-of-day tariffs, the IHD does not have a view of the actual rates per time period which leads to lots of energy forum posts with people complaining that they are being mis-charged. They are not! The actual costs are shown on the website or app. You can just use the IHD to display power or energy. I have disconnected mine and use the website and app to monitor energy use and costs. For me, smart meters have been essential; if you haven't opted for one yet, have a look to see what they can do for you.


