

only manage one project at present. Anyone wishing to help us with our projects would be welcome to join us particularly if they have skills in, or are an active user of, any of the facilities proposed.

The next steps for us now are to review and agree the proposed route of the trim trail and identify the exercise stations before we approach suppliers. We will need to gain agreement from landowners before we can proceed but we are hopeful that they will co-operate. Updates will be provided once we have made more progress on this. Meanwhile if you would like to help us please contact the Clerk.

#### **Use of Bottle Banks**

The bottle banks for recycling glass in Martlesham are:

- Martlesham Recreation Ground, The Street, Martlesham IP12 4RF
- Tesco, Anson Road, Martlesham Heath IP5 3RU
- The Square, Martlesham Heath IP5 3SL

These bottle banks are well used, which is welcomed, but sometimes there are problems with broken glass & litter on the ground around them and noise disturbance at night for local residents. Please do not leave any litter behind you. Please do not leave bottles beside full banks as they will not necessarily be collected and can be a

source of danger (especially near play equipment) and also attract anti-social behaviour. Each bin can be used for mixed glass so there is no need to distinguish between the colours; this is likely to prevent some banks being overfull whilst others have spare capacity. Please restrict use of the banks to a sociable time of day to avoid disturbing neighbours. 

# Michael Ian O'Brien Baker (known as Ian) celebrates 50 years as a Parish Councillor from May 1968 – May 2018

At its Annual Parish Meeting on Wednesday 25th May 2018 Martlesham Parish Council presented an engraved clock to lan as a token of appreciation of his work for the parish over 50 years. He also received a certificate from the Suffolk Association of Local Councils.

In 1968 Michael Ian O'Brien Baker, known as Ian, became a Martlesham Parish Councillor at the age of 25. A post he still carries out with distinction today.

In 1971 he became Council Chairman at the tender age of 28 and served until 1979.

He has always taken a very active role on the

council and he is closely associated with much that we see today. His highlights include:

- Attending the opening of the BT Research Labs and having lunch with the Queen;
- The development of the A12 and a land swap maintaining the substantial Common that we have today;
- Involvement in the planning and development stages of Martlesham Heath and the growth of the integrated community we have today;
- Council agent for the purchase of Kronji's Piece, land added to the Recreation Ground in Martlesham.

lan continues to undertake an active role on the Council:

- Always available to give advice and support on land maintenance and horticultural matters, from his vast stock of professional knowledge;
- Vast amount of background and historical knowledge which can inform current decision making;
- Play area inspector Kronji's Piece;
- Site inspections of the Recreation Ground;
- Regular checks of the automatic barrier at the Community Hall car park.

# MARTLESHAM HEATH HOUSEHOLDERS LTD

General Data Protection Regulations, no doubt you have been bombarded by many emails on this subject. MHHL has not been idle on these important regulations and you can read our Data Privacy Statement on https://goo.gl/Voeqng.

I am pleased to report that Councilor Patricia O'Brien has generously awarded MHHL £2,000 out of her locality budget to assist in the surfacing of two paths, these being between Heathfield to The Oaks and Lingside to Westland. This will help people wanting to walk or ride to Gorseland or Kesgrave Schools from the south of the village away from Eagle Way. Work will start in the next month or so and will be completed in time for the start of the new school year.

The football pitch opposite Gorseland School is no longer being maintained as a pitch and the broken fencing will be removed. We will be looking into the future use of this area.

There are still a small number of members that have not yet paid their membership fee. This is not acceptable, and we will be taking action to recover monies owed over the next few months. # CHRIS BLUNDELL'S DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT FOR JUNE 2018

East Suffolk. The two district councils of Suffolk Coastal and Waveney submitted their joint proposals for a revised warding pattern for the combined two districts that had been agreed by the two councils on 30th April 2018 to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) on 4th May 2018. They may accept our proposals or seek to make further amendments.

Because of the re-warding pattern many of the proposed new wards have been renamed. In the latest proposals the Martlesham Ward (current voter population 5551) has been expanded to include: Purdis Farm (1888), Brightwell (46), Foxhall (249) and Waldringfield (405). This will give us a total voter population of over 8,100 persons thus making it probably the largest ward by population in the whole of the proposed new East Suffolk District. The proposed new name for this Ward is recommended as 'Martlesham and Purdis Farm'. At the present time the new population growth at Brightwell Lakes in time for the 2023 elections can only be estimated.

The current timetable of events shows that by 3rd July 2018 LGBCE will publish their proposals on the warding pattern of the new area for consultation. That consultation will close on 27th August 2018. On 23rd October 2018 the LGBCE will publish their final recommendations and will table their review proposals to Parliament in January 2019 for approval in time for the local elections in May 2019.

**On a personal note,** my term of office as chairman of SCDC will have concluded by the time you read this. I have enjoyed the work and would like to say thank you for all the support that I have received during that time. It has been a pleasure to serve.



One early April morning, our young Nature Watchers braved the cold and damp to discover what creatures had been caught in our small mammal traps. Helped by the older Nature Explorers, the animals were carefully emptied from the traps, weighed and identified as male or female. 4 male and 1 female woodmice, and 1 male bank vole were caught. 
The main volunteer work of the month was to build a dead hedge, using as posts the branches from the storm damaged felled tree that had been cut up the month before. The hedge was filled in with all the fallen twigs and branches that had been blown down over the winter, so giving the woods a bit of tidy up. The weather has also taken its toll on the woodland paths, with several areas becoming extremely muddy after rainfall. We plan to restart our laying of chippings on these worst areas, and hope that the regular visitors to the woods will bear with us, as the chippings take a few weeks to 'bed in'. # **MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP**

The spring seemed to arrive later this year after the colder winter as evidenced by the appearance of migrant song birds such as the Nightingale. However after their late arrival we have a good number of Nightingales out on the heath this year distributed across the SSSI in the thicker more bushy vegetation. Nightingales have a complex and varied song and can get very loud if two adjacent males are competing against each other. They often sing through the night and large parts of the day too. They can usually be heard singing through into early June and then go quiet, so listen out in the first week of June as this could be your last chance to experience this wonderful birdsong until next year. Other migrant birds that have been making their presence heard include the Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat and Garden Warbler. Spring butterflies such as the Orange Tip, Holly Blue and Green Hairstreak have also added splashes of colour and dynamism to the landscape. In June these spring butterflies will be succeeded by summer species such as the Meadow Brown, Gatekeeper and various Skippers.

Our work party in June will take place on Sunday 10th June at 10am when we aim to cut bracken and thereby encourage more heather. Please meet out on the heath on the bank that runs east-west.

June should also see the emergence of the adult Silver Studded Blue butterflies on the heath. They could be later in the month, this year based on the late arrival of Spring. These small blue butterflies use heather as their caterpillar food plant but also involve small black ants in their life-cycle. Both need to be present for a successful colony. Later in the month or early in July we will attempt to count these butterflies, please get in touch if you would like to be involved.

#### **MARTLESHAM HEATH AVIATION SOCIETY**

Our meeting on Friday, 6th April was well attended for a talk given by Debbie Land and Peter Goff. The subject of their illustrated talk was "Time Flies at Old Warden" - the story of the Shuttleworth Collection of vintage aircraft and vehicles.

Debbie related the origins of this world famous collection and during the second half of the evening Peter Goff showed clips of some of the extraordinary aircraft that are kept in flying condition. The earliest example is a Bleriot XI - The same as the one flown across the English Channel by Louis Bleriot in 1909. Other aircraft from the Edwardian period include a 1910 Bristol Boxkite and 1910 Avro Triplane. The Bleriot's flying is restricted to a few feet from the runway but the other Edwardians can obtain a good height on a still day and are an impressive sight in the air. Many other aircraft include several Great War fighters and aircraft from the 20's and 30's, including the original DH Comet 88 which won the Mildenhall to Australia air race in 1934. The latest acquisition is a Mk 5 Spitfire which flew a few weeks ago after extensive restoration in the workshops.

# MARTLESHAM AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF AVIATION

Most people are aware that our attractive village of Martlesham Heath is built on the site of an old aerodrome. The MH100 celebrations on the village green last summer were held to mark the centenary of the establishment of a very important airfield.

However, not everyone is aware that it was the centre for the development and evaluation of all aircraft - civil as well as military. Second in importance only to the Royal Aircraft Establishment at Farnborough. Martlesham was specifically chosen for this purpose and was known as the Aeroplane Experimental Unit in the days of the Royal Flying Corp, until it was renamed the Aeroplane and Armament Experimental Establishment in 1924.

The smart new Wickes store is built on the site of what was known as "B" Flight, where bombers and airliners were evaluated and tested. Some readers will remember the hangar and outbuildings that stood on this site and that of Tesco's.

# B Flight and The Development of Airliners.

In 1920 the Air Ministry held a competition to encourage the development of aircraft designed to carry passengers. There were three categories. Light aircraft, large aircraft and seaplanes. The first two categories were evaluated at Martlesham and the flying boats at the Marine Experimental Station at Felixstowe.

The Air Ministry were disappointed that they were developed from WW1 bombers and none of them entered service as airliners.

However, airliner development continued and one of the more successful aircraft was the Handley Page HP42. It gained a Certificate of Airworthiness in 1931 after trials at Martlesham. A 32 seater version flew regular passenger flights between London and Paris and a 28 seater version flew from London to

Karachi on what was one of the "The Empire Air Routes", until the outbreak of war, in 1939.

# B Flight and the development of bombers.

The Bristol Blenheim was designed in 1934, as an airliner, but was used throughout WW2 as a light bomber. Known initially as "Britain First", it was an attempt to produce a fast small airliner. However, it's potential as a bomber was recognised and the government of the day were slowly waking up to the threat posed by Nazi Germany. It arrived at B Flight, Martlesham Heath in June 1935 as Bristol 142, "Britain First," for "high performance trials". The Bristol Blenheim, as it was later re-named, was obsolete by the outbreak of WW2. Nevertheless 4,422 Blenheims, or versions of Blenheims were built and served throughout WW2.

Another famous WW2 bomber arrived early in 1937 at The Aeroplane and Armament Establishment, or A&AEE, as it was known. The Vickers Wellington assigned to Martlesham for development trials tragically crashed on the Brightwell side of the aerodrome on an evening flight in April 1937 whilst on diving trials. The pilot was thrown out and survived, but the only other crew member died in the crash. The fault was diagnosed and another Wellington arrived at Martlesham to complete the trials. The Wellington, or "Wimpy", as it was affectionately known was the principal medium bomber used by the RAF until it was gradually replaced in 1943 by the Avro Lancaster. 11,461 Wellingtons were built. More were built than any other British bomber.

# The "Battle Of Britain Flight"

At the outbreak of war, in 1939 the A&AEE was deemed too close to the coast and was moved out of the line of fire, to RAF Boscombe Down, where it remains to this day, but under a different name.

Post-war Martlesham saw a return of development, but on a much reduced scale. 1958 saw the arrival of the "Battle of Britain Flight". It did not become "The Battle of Britain Memorial Flight" until the Lancaster joined them. This was also based on the old B Flight area. The picture shows the aircraft being prepared for the annual flypast over Buckingham Palace in 1959. The Spitfirecrash landed on a cricket pitch at Bromley after safely

passing over Buckingham Palace. The teams had gone in for tea and there were no casualties.

The Battle of Britain Flight left for RAF Coltishall in 1961 and RAF Martlesham reverted to a "care and maintenance" role before being decommissioned 0n 25th April 1963.

The next time you make that all too familiar trip to Tesco's remember that you are in the footsteps of the pioneers at Martlesham, in this "Cradle of British Aviation".
